Sensory Play Activities

- Ensure all staff and children clean their hands before and after sensory play activities
- Use tubs / bins / surfaces that have been cleaned and disinfected*
- Empty water play tub / bin (or individual bin) after each use
- Store reusable sensory materials in covered containers
- Discard used homemade playdough daily
- USE individual bins for children with a cold, cough or intestinal upset
- SUSPEND communal sensory play during an outbreak





<u>Notes</u>

- Examples of sensory play materials may include:
 water pasta sand gravel potting soil and playdoug
 - water, pasta, sand, gravel, potting soil and playdough
 - The following sensory play materials are not recommended:
 - Sand, gravel, and other materials obtained from outdoor locations
 - Meat trays, or soiled egg cartons and toilet paper rolls
 - Manure or other products containing possible fecal matter or chemicals
 - Refer to Guidance Document, Environmental Cleaning and Disinfecting
