1. Nigel Williams (Report No. 6292)

Holder of Tow Truck Driver's Licence No. D09-4304318

DECISION:

The Tribunal approved the following joint settlement:

Nigel Williams' tow truck driver's licence will have the following conditions imposed, effective immediately:

- (1) the licence shall be suspended for a period of three (3) weeks to commence on April 9, 2015 and the licensee must surrender his tow truck driver's licence and photo card on that date;
- (2) Mr. Williams must pay any outstanding fines within six (6) months of today's date and provide proof of same to Municipal Licensing and Standards;
- (3) immediately upon being renewed, the licence will be placed on probation for a period of four (4) years to commence on April 9, 2015;
- (4) prior to each of the next four renewals of the licence, Mr. Williams must provide to Municipal Licensing and Standards, at his own expense, an updated driving abstract and criminal record;
- (5) Mr. Williams must attend and pass an anger management course, at his own expense, and present a certificate of completion to Municipal Licensing and Standards within two (2) months of today's date;
- (6) Mr. Williams must advise the outcome of his four court dates to Municipal Licensing and Standards within 3 business days;
- (7) during the probationary period, if Mr. Williams incurs any new charges or convictions under the *Toronto Municipal Code*, the *Highway Traffic Act* or the *Criminal Code*, he must notify Municipal Licensing and Standards, in writing, within three (3) business days which can be done in the following ways:
 - in person at 850 Coxwell Ave, Toronto, Ontario M4C 5R1;
