Midtown in Focus: Building a Livable Yonge-Eglinton

Midtown is a community that has experienced significant change in the last decade. To ensure that future growth contributes positively to the area, the City of Toronto is undertaking a comprehensive study of growth and infrastructure issues: [Midtown in Focus](#). The result will be a renewed plan for Midtown and policy and infrastructure strategies to support livability in one of Toronto's most dynamic neighbourhoods.

Today's event includes community walks and a workshop focused on identifying opportunities for a safer, better connected, more inviting and beautiful public realm in the Davisville area.

While walking and working in your groups, consider the following:

- 1. What are your favourite and least favourite public spaces in the Davisville area? Why?**
- 2. What are the defining characteristics of the existing public realm in the area? What characteristics should be enhanced as the community continues to evolve?**
- 3. Where can the pedestrian experience be improved? Consider congested routes and corners, unsafe conditions, conflicts with vehicles, etc.**
- 4. How can existing mid-block connections be improved? Consider improvements to accessibility, lighting, eyes on the street, wayfinding, landscaping, etc. Where are additional mid-block connections needed?**
- 5. Consider the streets you'll be walking along. How can the right-of-way be rebalanced for all modes?**
- 6. How can the use of park space be enhanced? What uses are missing presently from the area's parks?**
- 7. Where do you think there are opportunities for new parkland? Consider areas currently lacking park space and opportunities to expand existing parks.**
