### **Transportation Assessment**


A Transportation Assessment of the Yonge-Eglinton area is being completed as part of the Midtown in Focus study.

The Assessment will:

- Document existing conditions for all transportation modes;
- Conduct a travel survey to assess existing travel behaviour patterns of residents and employees in the area;
- Identify focus areas (e.g. key intersections, street segments) based on the background review and growth analysis;
- Evaluate trends, constraints and opportunities of all transportation modes for each identified focus area;
- Identify key issues and opportunities that take into account anticipated growth, demographic, behavioural, and technological changes and the need for a shift towards active/sustainable transportation; and,
- Support updates to the City's cycling plan and align with regional transit planning initiatives.





## WHAT WE'VE HEARD

New parking should be below-grade

> Some streets, like Davisville, should be "community" streets" that are slower with room for all modes










