Transmission Watermain Relining on Macpherson Avenue, Boulton Drive and Russell Hill Road

Contract: 16ECS-LU-01-TT Start Date: June 19, 2017 End Date: September 30, 2018 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is re-lining the transmission watermains on Macpherson Ave, Russell Hill Road and Boulton Drive. The City will also re-line a local watermain on Boulton Drive and replace City-owned portion of water services if they are sub-standard (see map).

Transmission watermains carry large volumes of water from water treatment plants to pumping stations, reservoirs; and to the local watermains that then deliver water to your home through water services.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew our aging water infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live on **Boulton Drive** in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- re-line the existing watermains underground, which minimizes traffic delays and disruption (compared to the trench method)
- In order to re-line the watermains, the contractor will construct access shafts and shaft sites (see map) along the route so the contractor can launch and operate the re-lining machine.
- The local watermain re-lining on Boulton Dr will require a temporary by-pass water pipe above ground to maintain water supply to residents during re-lining.
- All areas affected by construction will be restored

This project will progress in 2 phases as per below:

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.		
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.		
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.		
8 9 9 9	Pre-Construction Inspection: Clearway Construction Inc., under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.		
8	Traffic Management: All efforts will be made to maintain the southbound traffic lane and bike lane on Russel Hill Road and Boulton Drive.		
	The westbound lane on Macpherson Avenue will be closed for traffic during construction work.		
	Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.		

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Construction Notice

R	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .	
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>	
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
