Road Reconstruction & Resurfacing Birchmount Road from St Clair Avenue East to Eglinton Avenue East

Contract: 17ECS-TI-112LR

Expected Start Date: Late-August 2017

Expected End Date: Late-December 2017

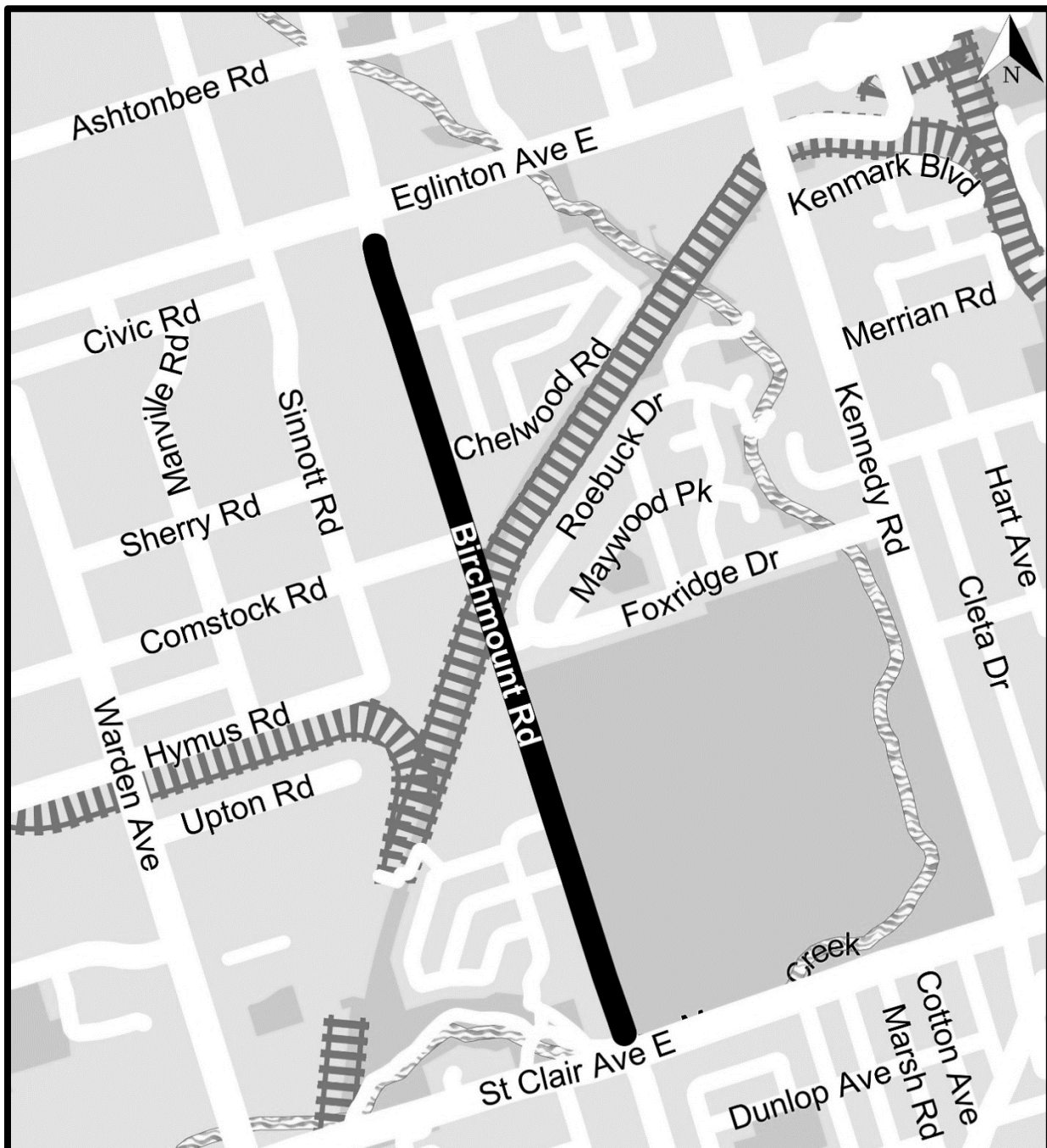

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface the road on Birchmount Road from St Clair Avenue East to the CNR Tracks, and reconstruct the road from CNR Tracks to Eglinton Avenue East.

The work includes replacing both sides of the curb for the majority of the project area. A large portion of the sidewalks will be reconstructed and widened to a width of 1.8 m and, most of the asphalt boulevards will be removed and replaced with grass.



This work is needed to bring the road to a state of good repair and improve storm water runoff. This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure and improve water distribution.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes is expected. This work includes removing and replacing (and depending on your location, modifying) driveways, municipal sidewalks and boulevards, as required.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.

	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: The contractor will survey all properties within 30 metres the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
