
Bridge Rehabilitation of the Morningside Avenue Bridge Over Highland Creek, Road Resurfacing & Sidewalk Installation

Contract #: 17ECS-TI-02BE Expected Start Date: April 10, 2017 Expected End Date: November 30, 2017 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the Morningside Avenue Bridge over Highland Creek and resurfacing Morningside Avenue from Ellesmere Road to Kingston Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaying and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads for current and future needs.





WORK DETAILS

Construction Crews will:

- Replace the existing deck, girders, sidewalk, parapet walls and approach slabs of the Morningside Avenue Bridge over Highland Creek.
- Widen the bridge by 3.6m to accommodate future bicycle lanes on both sides of the bridge.
- Resurface Morningside Avenue in the area noted above
- Replace damaged/deteriorated curbs and sidewalk.
- Construct a new sidewalk constructed from north of the bridge to Ellesmere Road on the east side of Morningside Avenue.

Construction will take place in three stages:

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm Monday to Friday and from 9:00 am to 11:00 pm on Saturday and Sunday, as required. Occasionally, work may continue beyond these specified hours to meet the specific demand of the project.	
	The Contractor on this project will use extended work hours to minimize traffic disruption and to shorten the project duration.	
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restorations within the construction work area.	
	Access to Morningside Park will always be maintained during the construction.	
	The pathway under the bridge will remain open for pedestrians, with a debris protection platform built under the bridge.	
	Lanes and driveways that serve businesses in the area will remain accessible for deliveries and service during the project.	
•	April to September: The west sidewalk will be open for pedestrians.	
入	September to November: The east sidewalk will be open to pedestrians.	
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.	
	Morningside will be reduced to one lane of traffic for the duration of the project from Kingston Road to Ellesmere.	
	TTC Route Information: This project will affect travel times on the 116 Morningside Route. Visit <u>www.ttc.ca</u> for more information.	
	Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.	
Ė	Accommodation: Residents that require accommodation must contact the project manager to arrange for access during construction.
