In June 2015, the City of Toronto launched ConsumersNext - a study that is looking for ways to manage anticipated growth, while improving the Consumers Road Business Park and the area around Sheppard and Victoria Park Avenues.

At its meeting of July 4, 2017, City Council adopted a Proposals Report for ConsumersNext.

The Proposals Report was based on the Final Reports prepared for the ConsumersNext Planning Study, Economic Potential Study and Transportation Master Plan, reflecting the work of the City and its consultant team and input provided by residents and stakeholders through a number of community meetings and open houses.

City Council also directed staff to undertake additional stakeholder and public consultation on the future policy directions to be brought forward in a new Secondary Plan for the ConsumersNext study area.

Join us on December 13, 2017. City Planning staff are hosting an open house on the draft Secondary Plan and next steps. This is your opportunity to provide feedback to help shape the draft Secondary Plan and ask questions of City staff. You are welcome to attend at any time during the open house.
