
Laneway Reconstruction East of Hazelton Avenue from Scollard Street

Expected Start Date: Late-April 2017 Expected End Date: Late-October 2017 *Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct a laneway in your area. The laneway runs south of Scollard Street and is 40m east of Hazelton Avenue. Our inspection of the laneway shows that it needs reconstruction to bring it to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and laneways for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts.

	Pre-Construction Inspection : The contractor will survey all properties within 30 metres the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.
Ŀ.	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
