### Streetscaping on Queen Street West From Bathurst Street to Spadina Avenue

#### Contract: 17ECS-TI-08SP Expected Start Date: June 19, 2017 Expected End Date: November 30, 2017 \*Timeline is subject to change.

Work on Queen Street West is scheduled to start the week of June 19. Streetscaping along Queen Street West from Bathurst Street to Spadina Avenue will include new tree plantings, street lighting and public art. Work will begin on Queen Street West at Bathurst Street on the south side, and move easterly to Spadina Avenue.

Construction of the new parkettes on Denison Avenue and Ryerson Avenue will begin in late summer.

This project will improve the quality of the sidewalk and street environment and is part of the Council approved 2017 Capital Works Program.

#### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will be conducting work in two stages:

#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION:

**Work Hours:** Work will take place on Queen Street West from 7:00 am to 5:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

On Denison Avenue and Ryerson Avenue, work will take place in late summer from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

# Construction Update #5

	<b>Pedestrians:</b> Except for the short time when concrete is being poured, pedestrian access east and west on Queen Street West will be maintained at all times.
不	For public and worker safety, fencing will be installed around the temporary walkway and around the work zone. When required, fencing openings and board-coverings will be provided at business entrances. Wooden ramps will be provided for access when the sidewalk is being constructed beside business/apartment doorways.
(FO)	<b>Cyclists:</b> Cyclists are encouraged to use Adelaide Street West or Richmond Street West to avoid this construction zone.
8	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Traffic on Queen Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction.
$(\mathbb{R})$	<b>Parking / Stopping:</b> Parking / stopping in the active work zone is not permitted. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at <b>416-808-2222</b> .
	Traffic enforcement measures will be increased to address stopping and parking during this project.
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Business Access: The Contractor will notify businesses of any temporary access restrictions.
	Laneways: Laneways and driveways will remain accessible for deliveries or service.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	<b>Deliveries:</b> Businesses may want to consider adjusting delivery times as a result of the lane restrictions on Queen Street for the duration of this project, or discuss smaller vehicles with their delivery providers.
	<b>Restoration:</b> This construction work area will be restored through the reconstruction and resurfacing of the sidewalks and through the addition of streetscaping.
