South Mimico Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation Soil Sampling on Bonnyview Drive

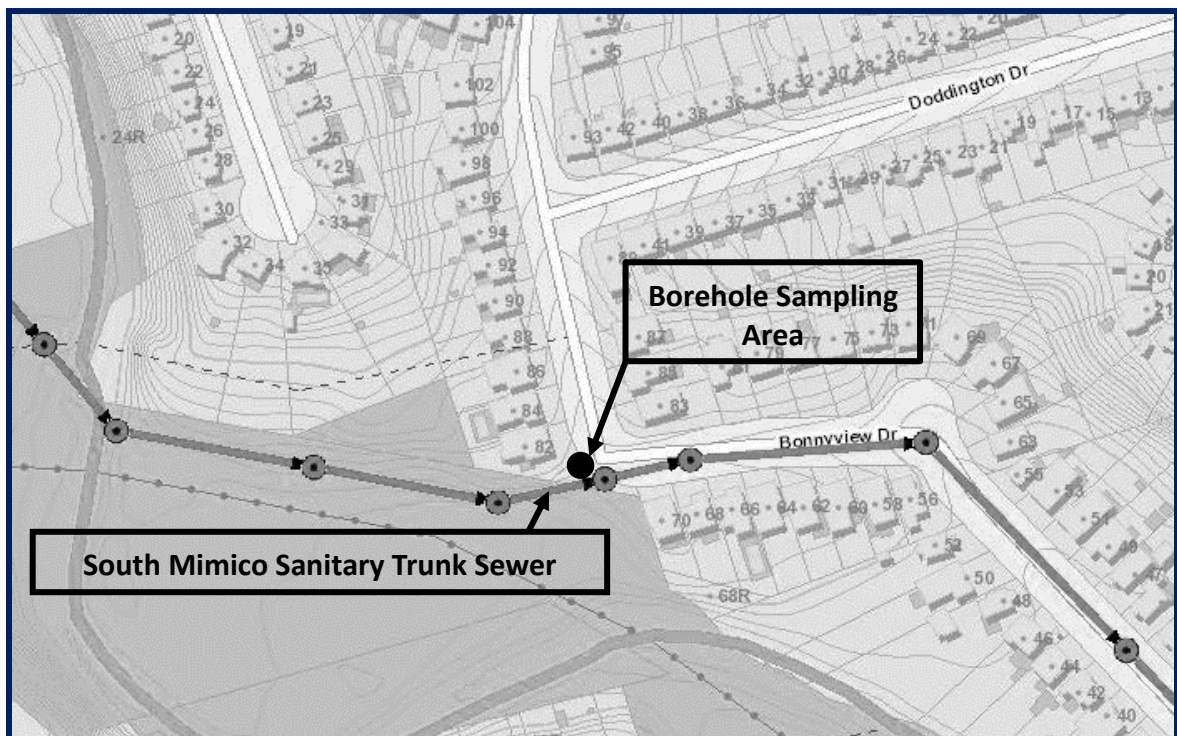

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate a two-kilometre long section of the South Mimico sanitary trunk sewer in 2018. Before the construction happens, soil investigation is required to complete the detailed design of the trunk sewer sections located below grade on Bonnyview Drive.

The South Mimico sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that conveys wastewater collected from local sewers to the Humber wastewater treatment plant.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to improve and renew aging infrastructure, reducing the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer back-up. The rehabilitation work will extend the service life of this section of sewer by 50 years.

WORK DETAILS

- A drilling rig will drill deep boreholes (approximately eight-metres) as depicted in the map. This work will take about three days.
- The borehole is located within the Etobicoke Hydro Greenspace limits.
- The borehole will be filled with mortar cement upon completion of soil sampling and ground water measurement work.
- City will issue a pre-construction notice before the Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation work starts.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING SITE WORK

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impact on the residential area. We appreciate your patience.
