## Combined Sewer Replacement on Hillborn Avenue at Spears Street

Contract: 17ECS-TI-03LR Start Date: August 8, 2017 End Date: November 30, 2017 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will replace a small section of the combined sewer and the City-owned portion of sanitary service laterals at the intersection of Hillborn Avenue and Spears Street.

The sanitary sewer


service lateral is the pipe connecting your home's plumbing to the City's sewer, the water service is underground pipe that brings clean water to your home; both of these pipes are owned by you <u>and</u> by the City. The part that you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns goes from the sewer and watermain to your property line.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to improve water distribution and renew aging infrastructure reducing the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live in a house in the area depicted in the map that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

#### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Excavate the road and dig a trench to access and install the new sewer
- Replace any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards from the watermain to the private property line
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass when the underground works are complete

#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<b>Work Hours</b> : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.	
	<b>Pre-Construction Inspection: Wristen's Home Specialties Inc. (WHS)</b> , under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.	
	<b>Water Service Disruptions:</b> From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not received advanced notice, an <i>emergency water shut off</i> could have been necessary.	
L <sub>ing</sub>	<b>Substandard Water Service Replacement:</b> Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. If you want to replace your part of the water service pipe, contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes.

	<b>PLEASE NOTE:</b> any contract entered into to replace water services is between the home owner and the contractor.	
	<b>Sewer Service Disruptions:</b> If the sanitary sewer service from your property requires a disruption to complete repairs the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. During sanitary sewer service disruptions, you will be advised to limit your water use.	
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

# **Construction Notice**

	<b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.	
8	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.	
	Traffic on Hillborn will be reduced to one lane.	
$(\mathbb{R})$	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b> .	
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>	
	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). Permanent restoration work will take place within 18 to 24 months.
