PARTIAL INTERSECTION CLOSURE Lake Shore Blvd West @ Symons Street and Miles Road

Streetcar Track Replacement on Lake Shore Blvd West

Contract: 17ECS-TI-12SP Closure Start Date: 7AM Friday, September 8, 2017 Closure End Date: 6AM Monday, September 11, 2017 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City contractor's work on Lake Shore Boulevard West continues. In order to safely remove and replace the track allowance on a section of the street, the intersections of Lake Shore Blvd West at Symons Street and Lake Shore Blvd West at Miles Road will be partially closed for track replacement.


<u>This work will take place from 7AM Friday, September 8 to 6AM Monday, September 11, 2017.</u> Further update regarding the remaining work will be delivered in the coming weeks.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION		
	This intersection work will take place 24/7.	
24	 The loudest portion of work is on the first day when breaking and removing concrete. This type of work will stop at 11:00 p.m. The work hours will be split between the City's contractor and TTC staff working on the track replacement. Other work will take place over night. The overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding / grinding and concrete pouring/curing. Afterhours work by TTC is required to support the daytime construction and complete work more efficiently. 	
	Regular work hours on this project will resume on September 12.	
8	 Traffic Management: Eastbound and westbound traffic on Lake Shore Boulevard West will be maintained in the curb lanes through the intersection. Southbound traffic on Symons Street can turn right onto Westbound Lake Shore Boulevard only with no left turns permitted to Eastbound Lake Shore Boulevard. Northbound traffic on Miles Street can turn right onto Eastbound Lake Shore Blvd only with no left turns permitted to Westbound Lake Shore Boulevard. Drivers can access westbound Lake Shore Blvd West using Lake Crescent. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. 	
	TTC Service: 501/301 Queen and 145 Downtown/Humber Bay Express buses on Lake Shore Blvd W will be maintained through the intersection.	
	The eastbound and westbound transit stops on Lake Shore Blvd W at Symons St will be temporarily relocated nearby, and reinstated soon after work zone is cleared.
