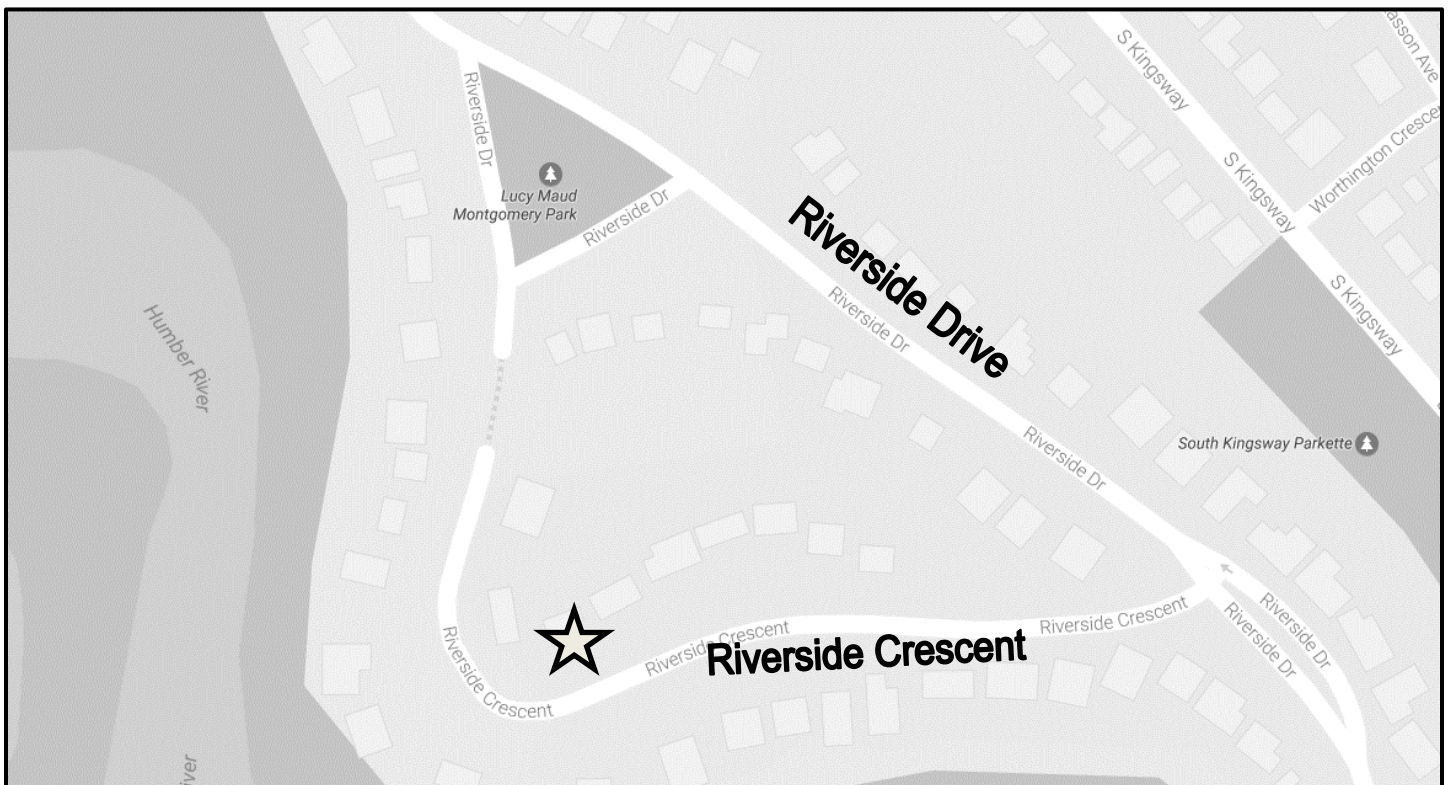
The City of Toronto's Riverside Wastewater Pumping Station collects wastewater (sewage) from homes and businesses in the area and pumps it to the Humber Wastewater Treatment Plant for processing.

Starting this summer, the City of Toronto will be conducting preventative maintenance and some upgrades to the station in order to improve efficiency and ensure long-term reliable service.

All work will occur on City property and is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Throughout the duration of the project, construction crews will:

- Excavate to install new underground pumping equipment and an entry to the wastewater well
- Conduct miscellaneous concrete repairs
- Remove and install new mechanical and electrical systems, such as new exhaust fans, heaters, duct work, control panels, data communication systems and lighting
- Install new fences and a walkway to the pumping station
- Complete landscaping and site restoration

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

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|  | <p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with occasional work after hours and on weekends, if required.</p> |
|  | <p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> |
|  | <p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Throughout the project, there will be periods of increased truck traffic on nearby main and side streets, which could result in delays.</p> |
|  | <p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p><i>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Project Manager listed below for more information.</i></p> |
|  | <p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). Permanent restoration of the road and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.</p> |
