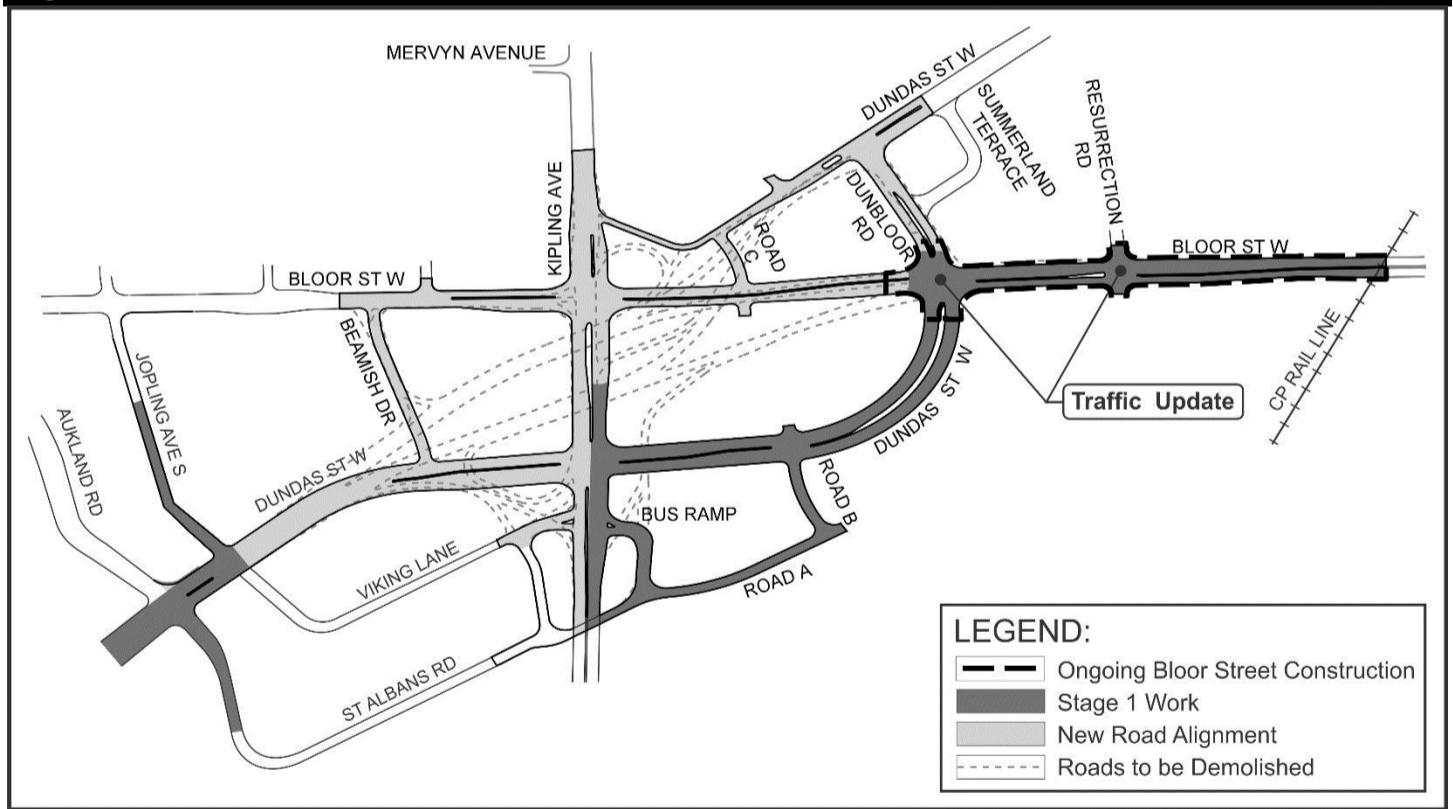
The City of Toronto has started Stage 1 construction of the Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration. Work during this stage will occur along:

- Bloor Street West (east side of Kipling Avenue)
- Kipling Avenue
- Eastern ramp to St. Albans Road

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 - 2025 Capital Budget and Plan, and supports the development of Etobicoke Centre as a vibrant mixed-use transit-oriented community. Additional Notices will be distributed as construction progresses to provide further information about the work taking place.

	<p>Transit Service: Road work will affect travel times of ALL Mi-Way, and TTC night routes that travel along Bloor Street West.</p> <p>Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.</p> <p>Visit mississauga.ca/portal/miway for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
