Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration



The City of Toronto has started Stage 1 construction of the Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration. Work during this stage will occur in stages along Bloor Street on the east side of Kipling Avenue, and on Kipling Avenue and the Bus Ramp (see map).

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 - 2025 Capital Budget and Plan, and supports the development of Etobicoke Centre as a vibrant mixed-use transit-oriented community.

Additional Construction Notices will be distributed as construction progresses to provide further information about the work taking place.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
(ı.	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
₩	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
Ø	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .

	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required in future stages of the work. Updates will be provided.
	Transit Service: This project will affect travel times of ALL TTC and MiWay Routes to and from Kipling Subway Station that travel along Bloor Street West.
