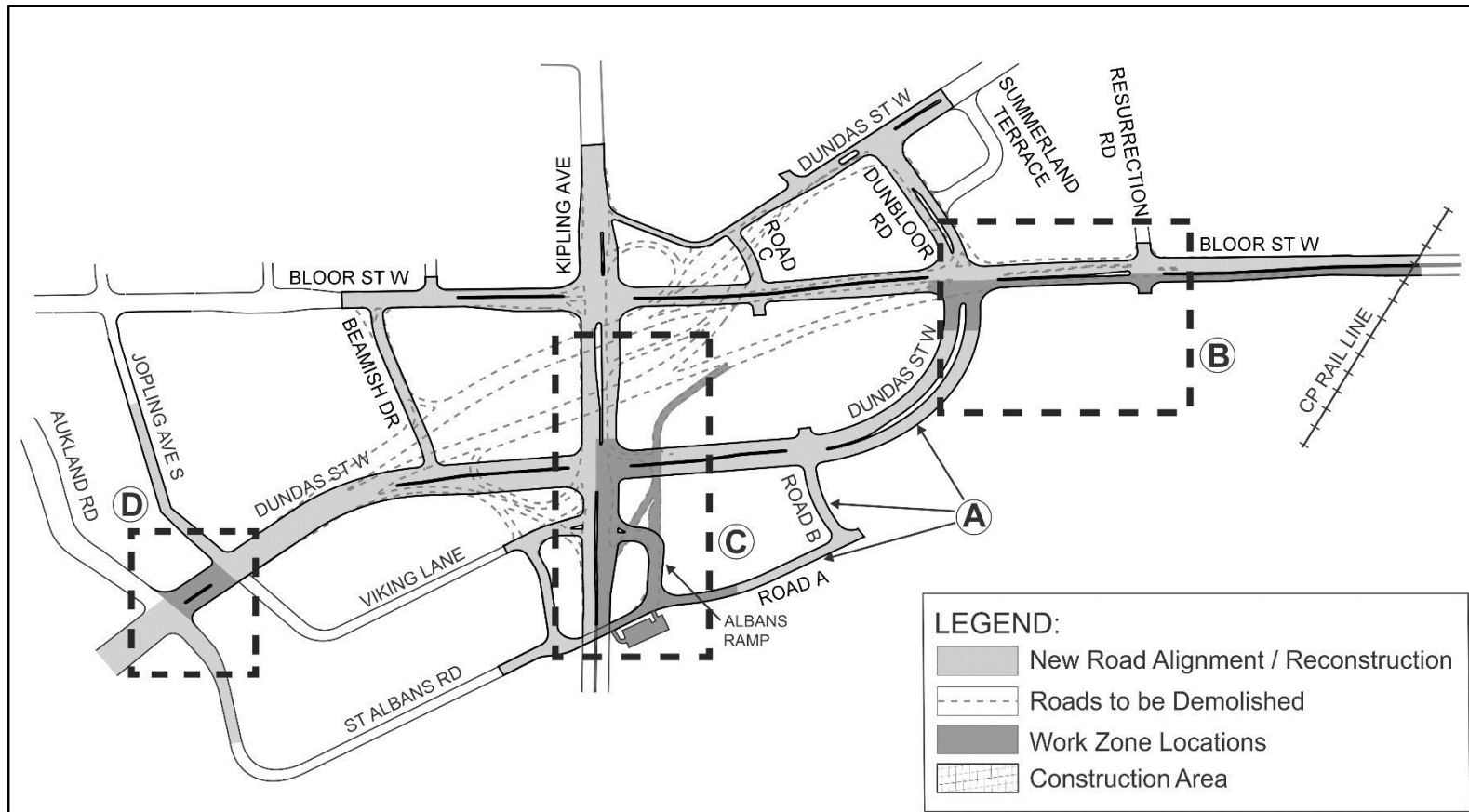
Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration: Stage 1

Contract: 16ECS-TI-01SP
Start Date: March 2017
Expected End Date: June 2018
Timeline is subject to change

The City of Toronto continues Stage 1 construction of the Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration. Work is taking place southeast of Bloor Street and Kipling Avenue (former Westwood Theatre lands), and locations along Bloor Street West, Kipling Avenue, Dundas Street West, and some ramps (see map). This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 - 2025 Capital Budget and Plan, and supports the development of Etobicoke Centre as a vibrant mixed-use transit-oriented community. Additional Notices will be distributed as construction progresses.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, subject to safe weather conditions, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>	
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Adequate signage will be placed in advance of any sidewalk restrictions. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>	
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <p>Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.</p> <p>This map shows the preferred alternate route to access Bloor Street eastbound from Kipling Avenue due to the ramp closure at Work Zone C (see Page 1).</p>	
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at 416-808-2222.</p>	
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>	
	<p>Transit Service: This project will affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay Routes to and from Kipling Subway Station that travel along Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue.</p> <p>Visit ttc.ca or mississauga.ca/portal/miway for accurate schedule information.</p>	
	<p>Village of Islington BIA and Local Businesses will be open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine, shop and play!</p>
