## EXTENSION OF WESTBOUND LANE CLOSURE LAKE SHORE BLVD W at Humber Loop

Track curve reconstruction

NEW Closure End Date: NOON Saturday December 16, 2017

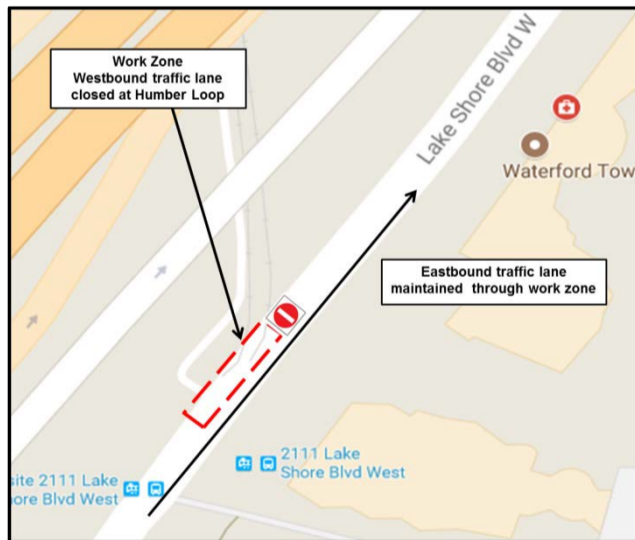

The current westbound traffic restrictions on Lake Shore Boulevard West between Palace Pier Place and Brookers Lane will remain in place until mid-day Saturday, December 16<sup>th</sup>. The need to extend the westbound lane closure resulted from an unexpected change in work on Lake Shore Blvd West at the Humber Loop entrance/exit. To comply with Enbridge safety regulations deep test pits were required, the contractor has had to locate a vital gas main and other underground utilities before proceeding with the track work. The westbound lane closure of Lake Shore Boulevard near Humber Loop will be extended for five additional days. Crews will work diligently to re-open the westbound lane by mid-day December 16<sup>th</sup>.

**Weather permitting the work which started on Monday December 4<sup>th</sup> will be completed by mid-day Saturday, December 16, 2017.**

Further updates regarding the remaining work will be delivered in the coming weeks.
