Expected End Date: August 2018*



The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the underside of the Bathurst Street Bridge, from south of the railway border to the end of the bridge. This work will include replacing the adjoining Fort York Pedestrian Bridge in 2018. This project does not include the heritage truss span over the railway corridor which is owned by Metrolinx.

The majority of the work is to take place beneath the bridge. This work will ensure that both bridges meet today's standards and remain safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future.

The project is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and the road with the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins
 with more information about the work.



Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, clear sidewalk path etc) must contact the **Project Manager** to arrange for access during the construction period.
