Road Resurfacing on Eglinton Avenue West from Martin Grove Road to Jane Street

Expected End Date: July 31, 2018

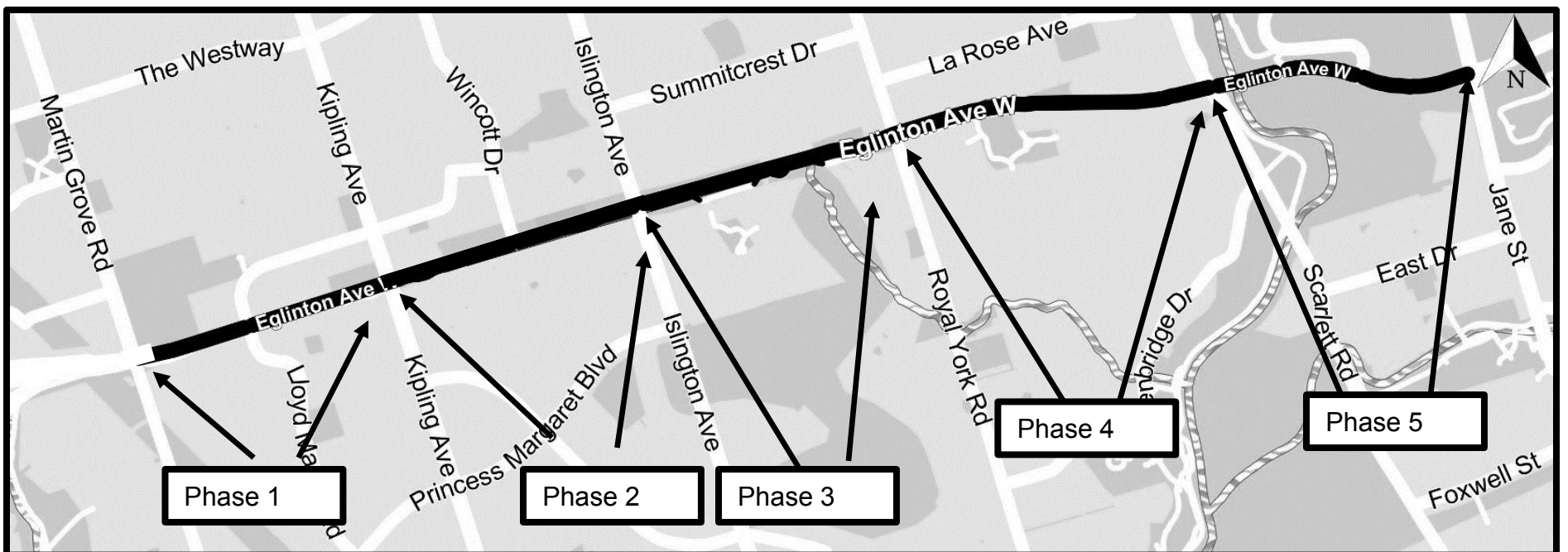

The City of Toronto started resurfacing Eglinton Avenue West. The contractor has completed the work from 100 metres east of Martin Grove Road, to Islington Avenue – phase 1 and 2.

The contractor will return in the spring of 2018 to complete the remaining phases of work. This work is being done because our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. A new sidewalk will be added on the north side of Eglinton Avenue West between Jane Street and Scarlett Road.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs. A new update will be distributed before work starts in the Spring.

WORK DETAILS

Work on this project will be delivered in five phases, starting west and working east. Work will be complete in one phase on both sides of the road before moving east.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners on Eglinton Avenue West should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard area), such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturdays after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Eglinton will be reduced to one lane in each direction in the work zone.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on all 32 Eglinton routes through the work zones.</p> <p>Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
