## Lane Flip along Harbour Street between Lower Simcoe Street to Bay Street Harbour Street Reconstruction

**Contract #16ECS-TI-06BE**

**Lanes Flip: 7:00 A.M. Saturday, December 16, 2017**

**Lanes Reopens: 5:00 P.M. Friday, December 22, 2017**

*Work is weather dependent and may be subject to change*

The City's contractor is working to complete the improvements on Harbour Street. The contractor has finished much of the work on the south side of Harbour Street and will be shifting traffic to complete some work on the north side of Harbour Street between York and Bay Streets. On **Saturday, December 16th the contractor will be moving construction activities to the north side of Harbour Street between York Street and Bay Street to complete the road reconstruction.**

Harbour Street should re-open to four lanes by the end of the day on Friday, December 22.




**The new York-Bay-Yonge Ramp will open in January 2018.**

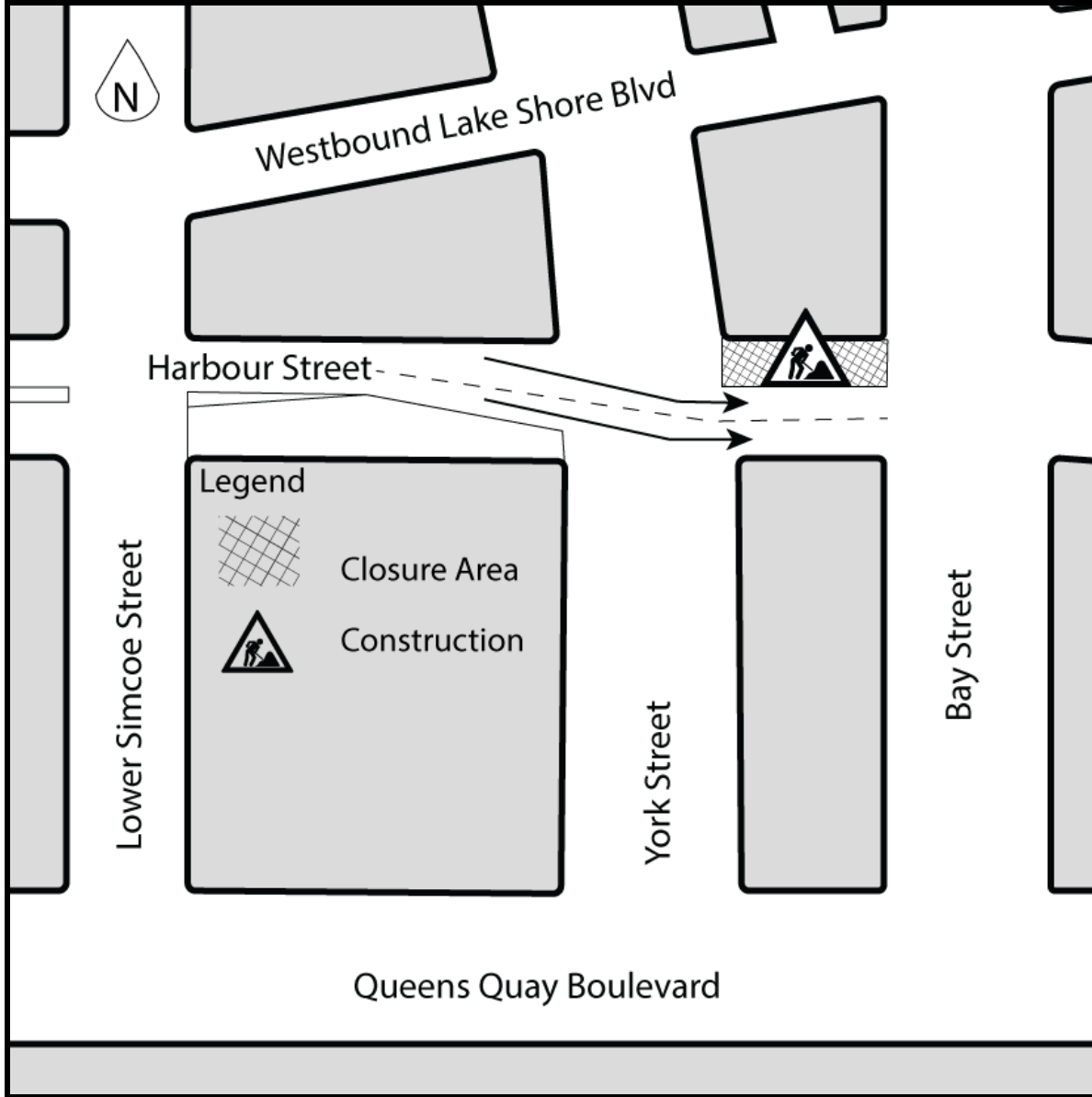

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> On December 16<sup>th</sup>, traffic movement will be affected as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Two north-side lanes on Harbour Street will be closed</b></li> <li>• <b>Two south-side lanes Harbour Street will be open</b></li> <li>• Westbound lanes on Lake Shore Boulevard West will remain open</li> <li>• Access to buildings will be maintained. Traffic control persons will assist motorists entering/exiting building garages</li> </ul> <p><i>Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.</i></p>
	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from <b>7 a.m. to 7 p.m.</b> Demolition of the existing road will be noisy (hydraulic breakers smashing concrete) but the remainder of work is not expected to be noisy. There will be a steady flow of trucks and heavy equipment. The Contractor will work Saturday and Sunday, weather permitting.</p>
	<p><b>Accommodation:</b> Residents that require accommodation must contact the Project Information Line to arrange for access during construction.</p>
