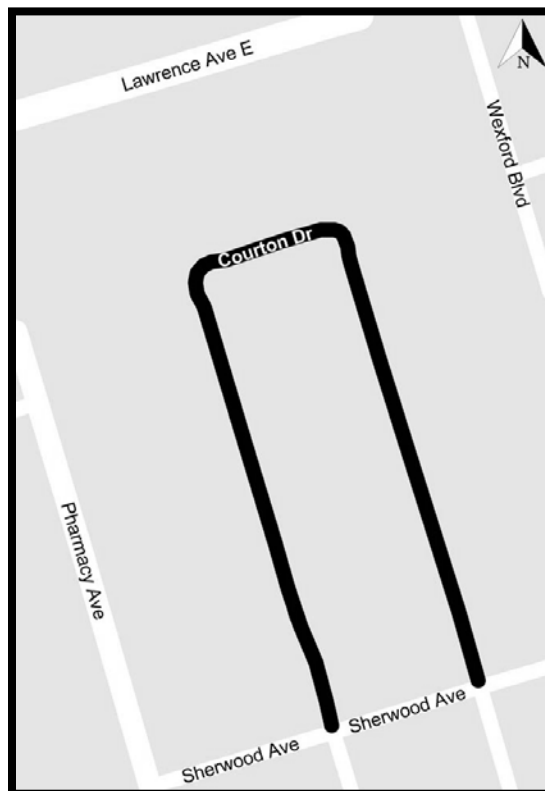

Due to upcoming winter holidays, the City of Toronto will stop work for two weeks on Courton Drive. The City will return to re-start work on January 8 2018.

All underground work will be completed by the end of March 2018. Final restoration work will be completed by the end of June 2018.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

WORK DETAILS

To date the contractor has:








- Installed the new watermain

The contractor will complete:

- New watermain connection to existing watermain on Sherwood Ave
- Test the new watermain
- Replacement of any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards from the water main to the private property line
- Decommissioning the old watermain
- Restoration of all work areas with asphalt, concrete and/or grass

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not received advanced notice, emergency water shut off could have been necessary.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Accommodation: Residents that require accommodation must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Traffic on Courton Drive will be reduced to one lane at times, and there may be temporary turning restrictions at intersections during construction activities. Traffic control personnel will be provided when required to facilitate traffic flow.
	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at 416-808-2222 .
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
