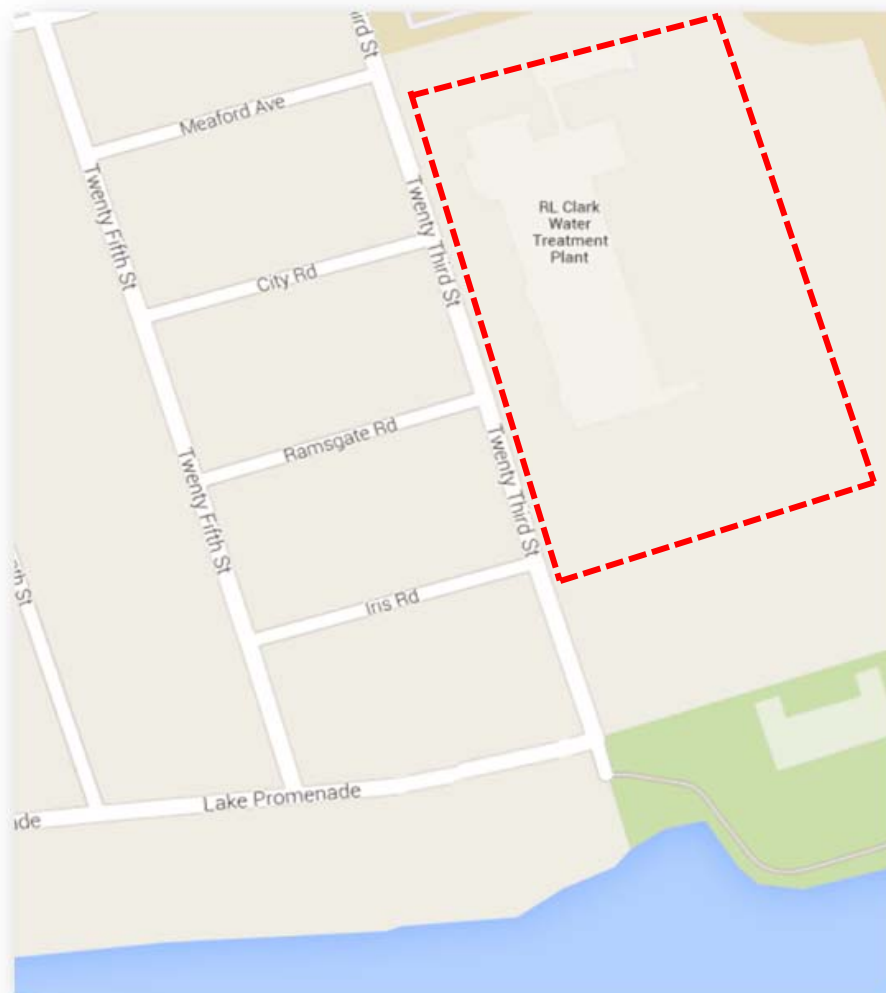
R.L. Clark Water Treatment Plant - Filter Upgrades

Expected Project Start Date: October 2014
Expected Completion Date: Dec. 2017

To better serve area residents and businesses, the City of Toronto will upgrade the existing filters at the R.L. Clark Water Treatment Plant. The rehabilitation will enhance the existing treatment and mechanical processes, and are aimed at improving water quality and supply reliability as well as infrastructure sustainability. The project will include building improvements, structural repair/rehabilitation, and automation modifications. This project is part of the City of Toronto council-approved 2014 Capital Works Program.

The work will take place within R.L. Clark Water Treatment Plant at 45 Twenty Third Street, Etobicoke. Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is appreciated.

Construction Details

Work will include the following:

- Update and modification of the existing 18 filters including addition of new filter underdrain systems, replacement of filter media, and all associated piping, valves, and controls.
- Installation of new air scour system.
- General building improvements including plumbing, and service water and drainage.
- Interior building improvements, and structural repair and rehabilitation.
- Other associated repairs and restoration work will also be performed as necessary.

What to Expect

All construction equipment and supplies required for this project will be stored onsite, within the work area outlined above. Large delivery trucks will be restricted to being onsite between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., and all efforts will be made to minimize truck idling on neighbourhood streets outside of work hours. Efforts will be made to minimize construction noise and dust, but some should be expected during working hours.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends only as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be increased street traffic due to the movement of construction materials and equipment in the area, noise and temporary inconveniences.

You will be further notified should any additional temporary disruptions arise or if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.
