

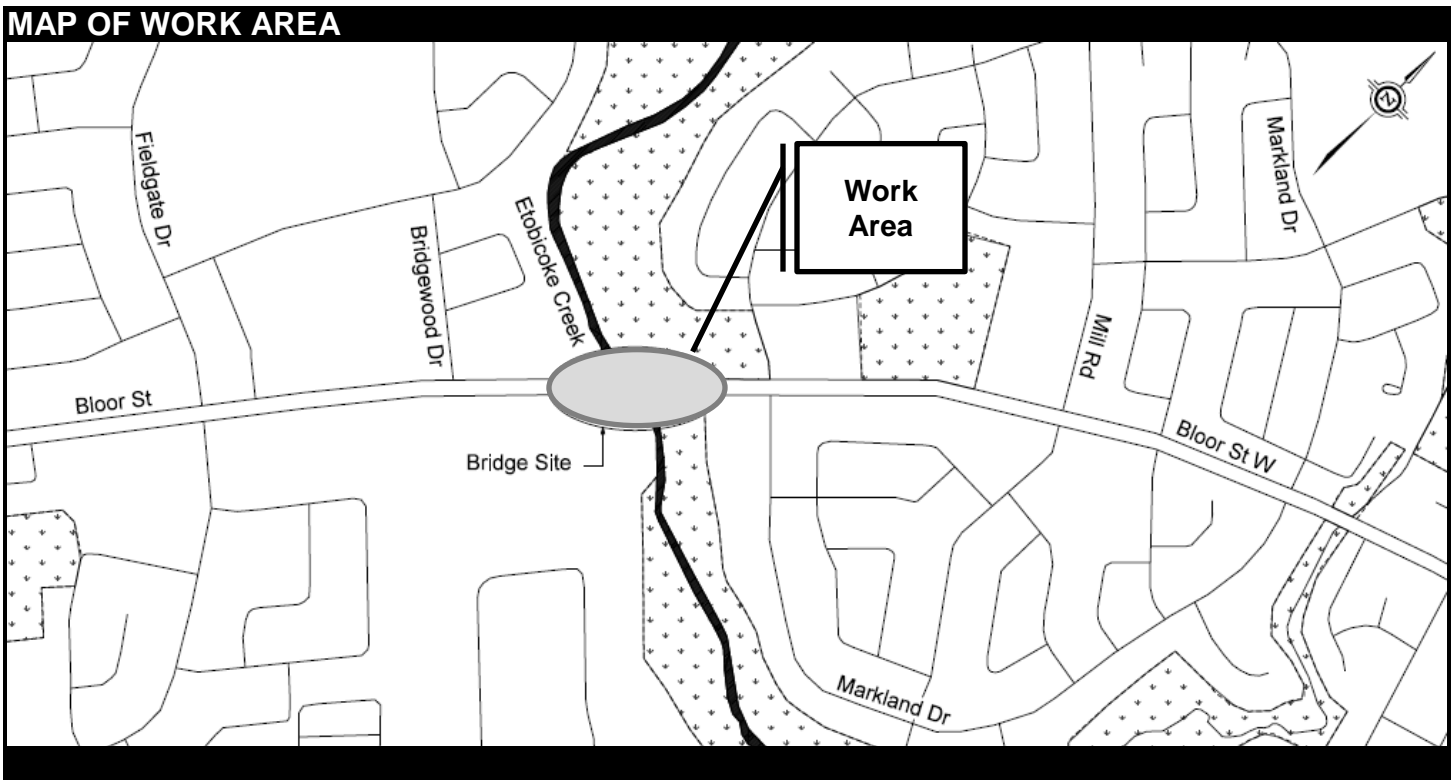

## Bloor Street West Bridge Rehabilitation over Etobicoke Creek

**Contract: 14ECS-TI-01BE**  
**Re-Start Date: April 2018**  
**Expected End Date: May 2018**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto began rehabilitating the Bloor Street West Bridge over Etobicoke Creek in September 2017. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future.

The project has required additional work, and the project completion has been deferred until more favorable weather conditions resume in the Spring. The current lane restrictions will remain in place over the winter.








### REMAINING WORK DETAILS

- Repair concrete deck on north half of bridge, waterproof and pave.
- Restore all areas affected by construction.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences when work resumes. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Upon restart, work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in more favourable weather conditions, the north half of the bridge will remain closed over the winter with one lane in each direction provided on the south half. The south sidewalk on the bridge will be accessible to pedestrians throughout the winter and during the construction period. The north sidewalk will remain closed until construction completion.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>
	<p><b>Transit Service:</b> This project will affect travel times of Mississauga Transit Routes that travel along Bloor Street. The TTC's Bloor Street route to the east of the bridge location (at Markland Dr.) may also be affected.</p> <p><b>Visit <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> or <a href="http://mississauga.ca/portal/miway">mississauga.ca/portal/miway</a> for accurate schedule information.</b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced if impacted by construction.</p>
