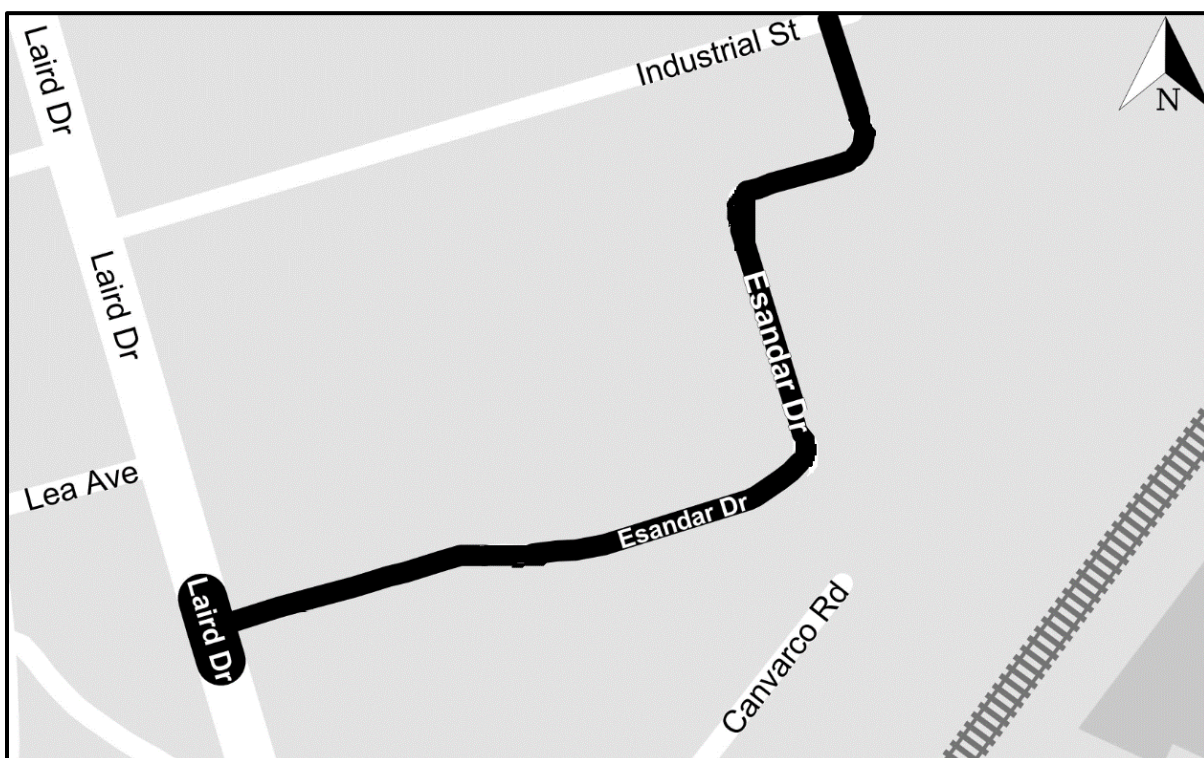

In late June 2017, the City of Toronto started the replacement of the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Esandar Drive. All watermain work has now been completed. Road restoration work was also completed on Esandar Drive ahead of the winter season.

Work crews will return in mid-April to complete the restoration of the intersection at Laird Drive, where the watermain work was undertaken. We had to wait until spring to finish the work as paving work requires consistently warmer and drier weather.

During the work, traffic will be restricted to one lane in each direction on Esandar Drive and Laird Drive as required. We recognize that a project of this nature is disruptive to the community and apologize for the inconveniences caused by the delayed end date.

WORK DETAILS

Before the winter break, the contractor:







- Replaced the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Esandar Drive.
- Restored the road, curb and sidewalk affected by the watermain replacement work on Esandar Drive excluding the Laird intersection.

Starting in April, the contractor will:

- Restore the watermain trench road base at the Esandar Drive and Laird Drive intersection.
- Complete road resurfacing at the watermain trench in the Esandar Drive and Laird Drive intersection.
- Complete landscaping restoration where required on Esandar Drive. Sod placement may be delayed until sod becomes available from the supplier

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>TRAFFIC WILL BE RESTRICTED TO ONE LANE IN EACH DIRECTION ON ESANDAR DRIVE AND LAIRD DRIVE AS REQUIRED.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them.</p> <p><i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.</p> <p>Sod restoration may be delayed until sod becomes available from the supplier.</p>
