West Don Sanitary Trunk Sewer Project Tree Removal in G. Ross Lord Park

Expected Start Date: March 26, 2018 Expected End Date: April 6, 2018

*Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto will be removing 41 trees in the ravine of the G. Ross Lord Park, in close consultation with staff in the Parks, Forestry and Recreation division, between late March and early April 2018 in preparation for a sewer rehabilitation construction project. Sewer construction is expected to begin August 2018 and completed by March 2019 and more details about that work will be included in a separate construction notice closer to that time. Notices will be posted in the ravine area to advise park users of this work. Once the work is completed, the City will replant trees (approximately three trees for each tree removed) and restore the area to its original condition, or better.

Tree removal will take place in the ravine area south of the asphalt path from the north parking lot that runs along the soccer fields, circled in red on the map below. City staff will post signage and barriers to prevent the public from accessing the ravine area. The asphalt path will be accessible to the public during the entire construction project.


