Launched in October 2016, Don Mills Crossing is looking for ways to focus and shape anticipated growth around the intersection of Don Mills Road and Eglinton Avenue East, anchored by the transit infrastructure being constructed as part of the Eglinton Crosstown LRT.



At its meeting of December 5, 2017, City Council adopted the Public Realm Plan Report to be used as a basis for the preparation of a proposed Secondary Plan for the Don Mills Crossing Study Area based on four Guiding Principles.

- 1. Create a Vibrant Mixed-Use Community
- 2. Connect with Nature and Build Resiliency
- 3. Enhance Mobility Choice, Comfort and Connectivity
- 4. Support Inclusive City Building

To support the development of the Secondary Plan, a Mobility Plan Study has also been initiated to examine the new transportation infrastructure and strategies necessary to support growth in the Study Area, including an extension of Wynford Drive and pedestrian and cycling connections over the rail corridor. The Mobility Plan Study will satisfy Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Process.

Join us on April 19, 2018. City Planning staff are hosting an open house on the draft proposed Secondary Plan policy directions and next steps. The City's consultant team will also be presenting the Preferred Solution for the Mobility Plan. This is your opportunity to provide feedback to help shape these documents and ask questions of City staff. An update will also be provided on the Wynford Green (Celestica) development applications. You are welcome to attend at any time during the open house.
