The City of Toronto's work to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Alhart Drive continues.

WHAT'S NEW

To-date, the Contractor has:

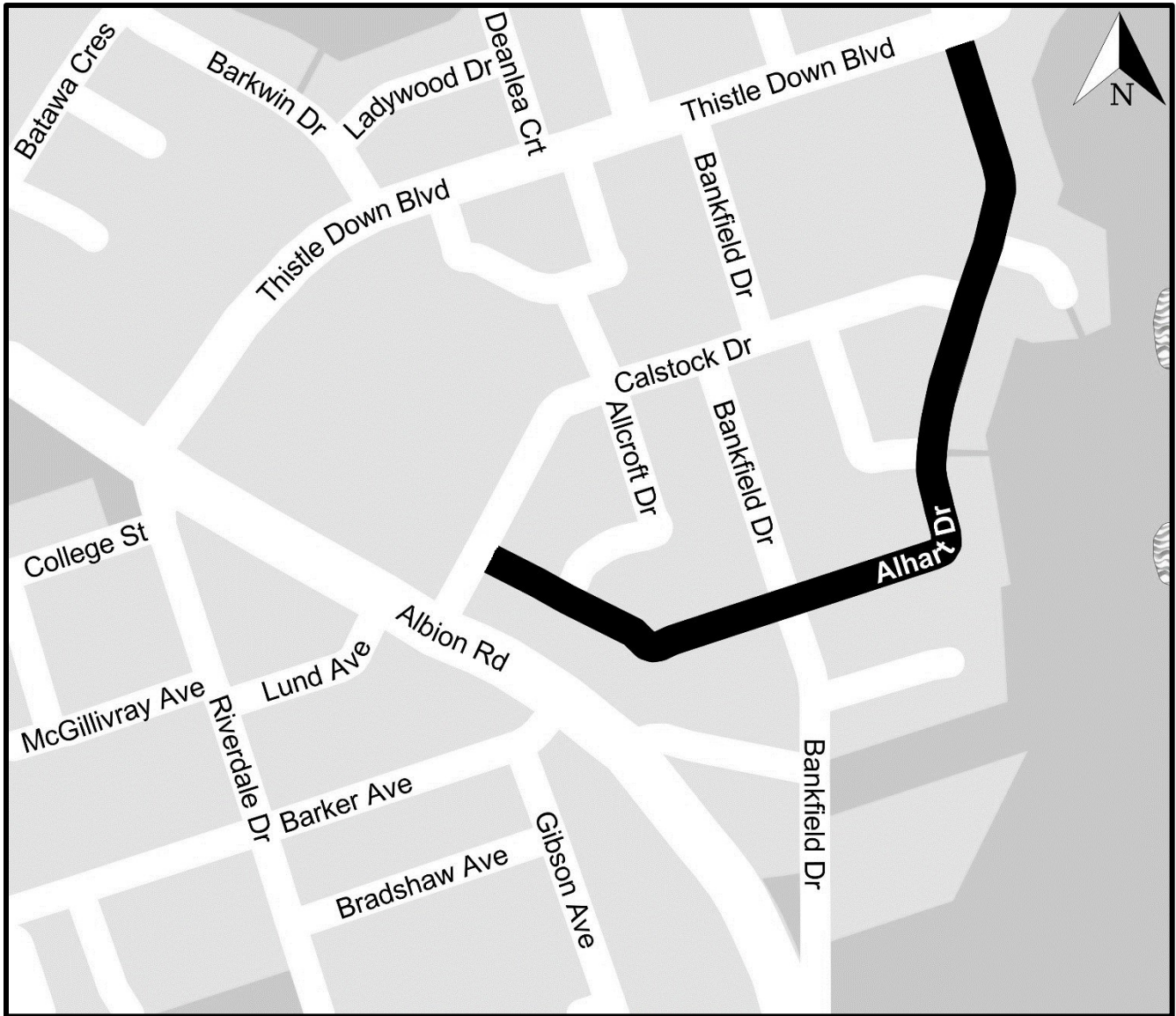
- Completed the installation of the new watermain mainline in the roadway;
- Completed the disinfection and testing for water quality of the new watermain mainline; and
- Connected the new watermain to the existing watermain system and transferred properties' water services from the old watermain to the new watermain.

This Spring, the Contractor will:

- Resurface affected lanes of Alhart Drive







Please note that completion of road resurfacing work is dependent on ground and weather conditions. The Contractor will provide a notice confirming the date and time of the repaving operation closer to the date.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm., Monday to Friday and 9:00 am to 7:00 pm on Saturday, with work after hours and on Sunday as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Alhart Drive may be reduced to one lane.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 118 - Thistledown bus. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>



Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
