Watermain and Storm Sewer Replacement on Ridgevale Drive and Brookview Drive

Contract: 17ECS-LU-01SU Start Date: July 17, 2017 Date: April 23, 2018 End Date: May 31, 2018 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto's work to replace the watermain, storm sewer, and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Ridgevale Drive & Brookview Drive continues.

We appreciate your patience as we work to complete this important infrastructure upgrade.

WHAT'S NEW

To-date, the contractor has:

- Completed the installation of the new watermain mainline in the roadway;
- Completed the disinfection and testing for water quality of the new watermain mainline; and
- Connected the new watermain to the existing watermain system and transferred properties' water services from the old watermain to the new watermain.

This Spring, the contractor will:


• Resurface affected lanes of Ridgevale Drive and Brookview Drive

Please note that completion of road resurfacing work is dependent on ground and weather conditions. The Contractor will provide a notice confirming the date and time of the repaving operation closer to the date.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.	
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.	
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.	
	Traffic on Ridgevale Drive or Brookview Drive may be reduced to one lane.	
	TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 52/352-Lawrence West Eastbound and 400-Lawrence Manor buses. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.	
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .	
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>	
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).	

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Asbestos in Asphalt

As part of the work, the City must test the removed asphalt to be removed for asbestos. Our tests show that there is up to 7.2% of asbestos in the asphalt.

Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1970s and early 1980s to improve the performance of the asphalt. Air quality monitoring conducted by the City of Toronto at other sites has not detected asbestos fibres in the air as a result of resurfacing of asphalt.

As a precaution, the City's contractor will follow these steps:

- Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding or removal
- Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible, to prevent dust from becoming airborne
- Provide personal protective equipment, such as disposable coveralls and respirators, to on-site workers upon request, and
- Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos at provincially approved disposal sites.
