Watermain Replacement on Castlefield Avenue At the Metrolinx Rail Crossing


The City's contractor has returned to install the final section of the planned watermain replacement on Castlefield Avenue across the Metrolinx Rail Crossing, just east of Kincort Street.

This portion of work was delayed in order to schedule the work and its delivery with Metrolinx.

We appreciate your patience while we continue to work to improve the City's infrastructure.

WORK DETAILS

To date, the following work has been completed:

- Watermain and water service installation on Castlefield Avenue from Kincort Street to Dufferin Street, except across the Metrolinx rail corridor east of Kincort Street
- Permanent restoration of affected sidewalks, curbs, and roadway.

The Contractor will:

- Set up and prepare necessary ground-level monitoring near the rail corridor;
- Install the new watermain on Castlefield Avenue across the Metrolinx rail corridor;
- Disinfect and test the new watermain for water quality; and
- Permanently restore affected sidewalks, curbs, and road base.

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WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00am to 7:00pm, Monday to Friday, and 9:00am to 7:00pm on Saturday, with work after hours and on Sunday as required.



Low-Water Pressure: Sections of the watermain will have to be isolated in order to safely complete the construction work.

Due to this work, all properties on Castlefield between Kincort Street and the Metrolinx rail corridor will notice a reduction in water pressure during the first few weeks of the construction period. Please contact the *Field Ambassador* below if you have any questions or concerns regarding this impact.

Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advanced notice, an **emergency water shut off** could have been necessary.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

Traffic on Castlefield Avenue will be reduced to one lane eastbound only from Kincort Street to Caledonia Road from March 26, 2018 to May 11, 2018.
