
Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration: Stage 2

Contract: 16ECS-TI-01SP Start Date: May 2018 Expected End Date: Summer 2019 *Timeline is subject to change*

The City of Toronto continues reconstructing the Six Points Interchange. Work is taking place southeast of Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue (former Westwood Theatre lands), and at locations along Bloor Street West, Kipling Avenue, Dundas Street West, and Kipling access ramps (see map). This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 - 2025 Capital Budget and Plan, and supports the development of Etobicoke Centre as a vibrant mixed-use transit-oriented community. Additional Notices will be distributed as construction progresses.

2. Dundas Street, <u>WEST</u> of Kipling Ave May 2018 – December 2018	Constructing the new southern portion of Dundas Street, west of Kipling Avenue. Installing street lighting, separate underground sewer, water and hydro utilities.	 Dundas Street reduced to two eastbound and two westbound lanes. Right turns onto Dundas Street not permitted from Viking Lane. Temporary sidewalk maintained on south side of Dundas St with access to Six Points Park. 	
3. Viking Lane Ramps June 2018 – December 2018	Reconstructing the Viking Lane access ramp to and from Kipling Avenue and installing new street lighting.	 No pedestrian access to Kipling Avenue, please use alternate routes.

4. Albans Ramp E June 2018 – September 2018	Constructing the new, St. Albans Road to Kipling Avenue-ramp. Work includes grading, streetscaping (landscaping, street lighting and underground cables), roads and curbs.	 No pedestrian access on this route, please use alternate routes.

5. Dundas Street, <u>EAST</u> of Kipling Avenue (former Westwood Theatre lands)	Constructing the new Dundas Street West. Installing new watermains, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, streetscaping (landscaping, street lighting and underground utilities), roads and curbs.	N/A
6. Kipling Avenue	Constructing temporary and subsequent permanent intersection improvements and traffic signal systems at Kipling Avenue and Dundas Street West.	 One lane of traffic in each direction maintained along Kipling Avenue at all times. Sidewalks maintained on east side of Kipling Avenue.
7. Bloor Street, <u>SOUTH</u> side	Installing temporary asphalt, new watermains, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, and streetscaping (including landscaping, street lighting and underground utilities).	 One lane of traffic in each direction maintained along Bloor Street from the west side of Dunbloor Road to the east project limit (CP Rail Line). Sidewalks maintained on east side of Kipling Avenue.
8. Dunbloor Road	Widening the roadway along the western edge and constructing various roadway and boulevard improvements; shrub removal, street lighting, and repaving.	 Widening work is not expected to impact traffic access along Dunbloor Road.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

(\mathbf{b})	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, subject to safe weather conditions, with work after hours and on weekends as required and approved by the City.
(c.	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Adequate signage will be placed in advance of any sidewalk restrictions. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
•	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. R	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at 416-808-2222 .
	Transit Service: This project will affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay Routes to and from Kipling Subway Station that travel along Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue.

-	Tree Removal: Trees will be preserved through tree protection measures. Some trees within the construction area will be removed in advance. New trees will be planted as part of the area restoration / design.
