### Road Resurfacing on Main Street from Kingston Road to Gerrard Street East

Contract: 18ECS-TI-07SP Expected Start Date: June 2018 Expected End Date: August 2018 \*Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface Main Street from Kingston Road to Gerrard Street East. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaying and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. To reduce the crossing distance for pedestrians and improve safety along Main Street, additional intersection work will also be carried out and will involve some curb extensions and pavement reductions.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes
  removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where
  necessary.

 Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

÷	<b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
א	Sidewalks along Main Street will remain accessible and pedestrians will be safely detoured around the work area to access local businesses.
i.	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area.

	<ul> <li>Monday to Friday: no diversion, buses will continue to serve Main Street. Temporary stop changes may be required depending on lane and sidewalk restrictions.</li> <li>Saturday and Sunday (when applicable): southbound buses travel over regular route.</li> <li>Northbound buses divert via Kingston Road, Woodbine Avenue, and Danforth Avenue to Main Street.</li> </ul>
	TTC Service: This project will affect service on Main Street
	Some weekend work will be carried out at the intersections of Benlamond Avenue and Swanwick Avenue. During this time, vehicular traffic will be reduced to one southbound lane only.
	One lane of vehicular traffic in each direction will be maintained on Main Street during the weekdays and most weekends.
8	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs and adjusting traffic signal times.
	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm, Monday to Friday, including some extended hours or weekend work as approved by the City.
