Intersection Improvements at Wanless Avenue and Kappele Avenue

Expected Start Date: July 2018 Expected End Date: September 2018 *Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto will be improving the intersection at Wanless and Kappele Avenues this summer.

The improvements at the intersection will include:

- Removing the southbound right-turn channel
- Reducing corner radii
- Re-aligning the pedestrian crossing points for improved sightlines and crossing distances at the intersection
- Adding a sidewalk connection to the park entrance
- Improving the public realm (wider sidewalks, tree planting, bicycle parking)

Intersection safety improvements provide a number of benefits:

- Improved sight lines for motorists and pedestrians
- Reduced vehicle speeds
- Improved accessibility and user experience for all pedestrians

This project is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

	Pre-Construction Inspection: The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: Properties who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the City to arrange for access during the construction period.
