### Road Resurfacing, Sidewalk and Curb Repairs on Walmer Road from St Clair Avenue West to Heath Street West


Contract: 17ECS-TI-13LR Start Date: June 2018 End Date: July 2018 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will resurface Walmer Road from St. Clair Avenue West to Heath Street West and repair damaged sections of curb and sidewalk.

Our inspection of the road shows that it needs resurfacing and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. This work will take about 6 weeks to complete.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

#### WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Dig up the road surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repair curbs, sidewalks and driveways
- Repair the road base as required
- Repave the road surface

#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping, sprinkler systems, and/or decorative objects.

# **Construction Notice**

• The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, including sprinkler systems, unless there is an existing encroachment agreement.

	<b>Work Hours</b> : Work will take place Monday to Friday from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, with work after hours and on Sunday as approved by the City.
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.
	Traffic will be reduced on streets with active construction / access may be limited when paving operations are taking place.
$(\mathbb{R})$	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b> .
	In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.
	Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones. A separate parking notice identifying parking restriction times will be issued.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
