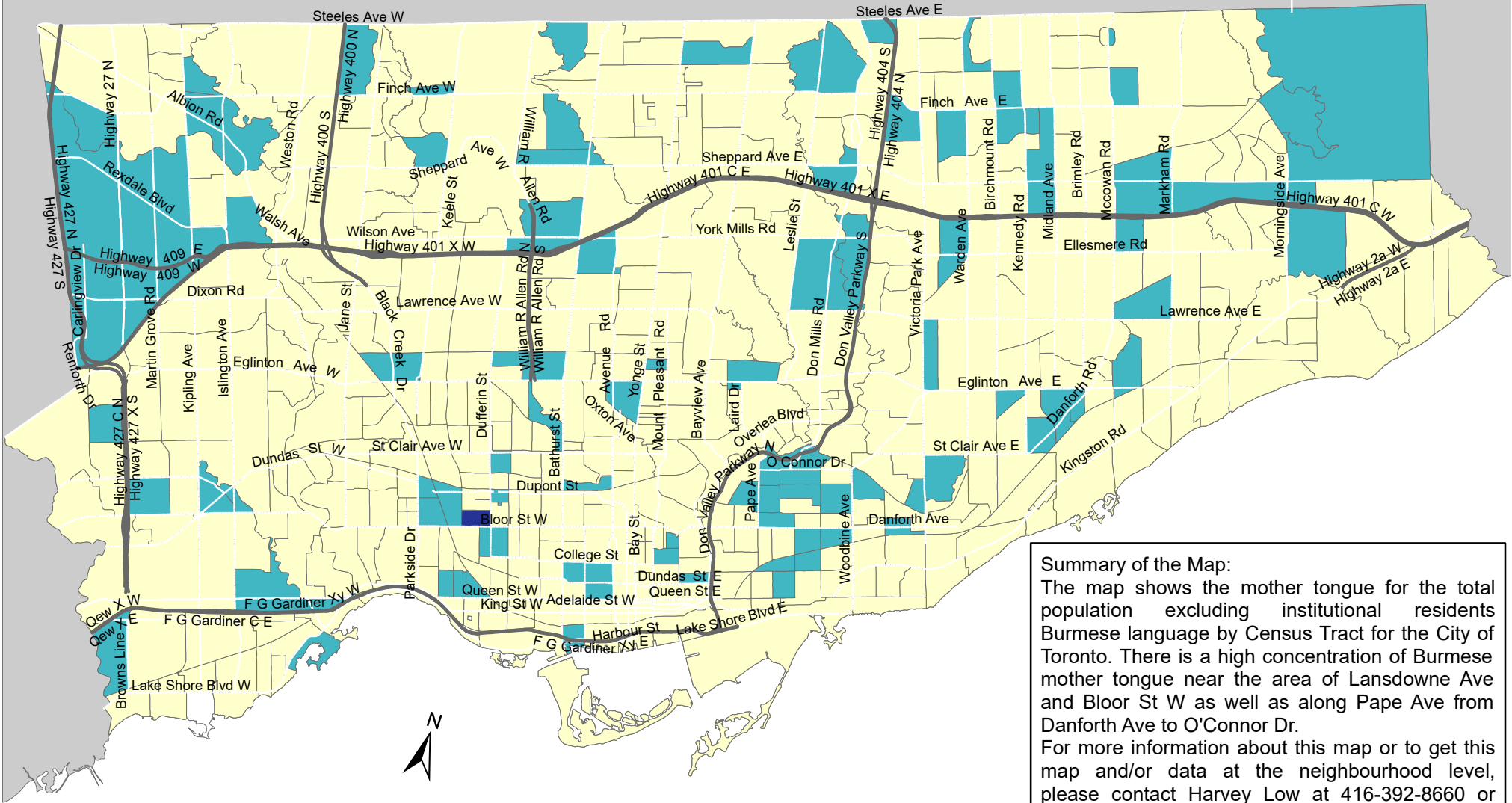
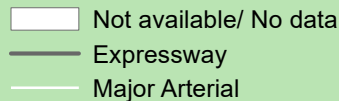
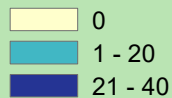


City of Toronto Mother Tongue - Burmese 2016
