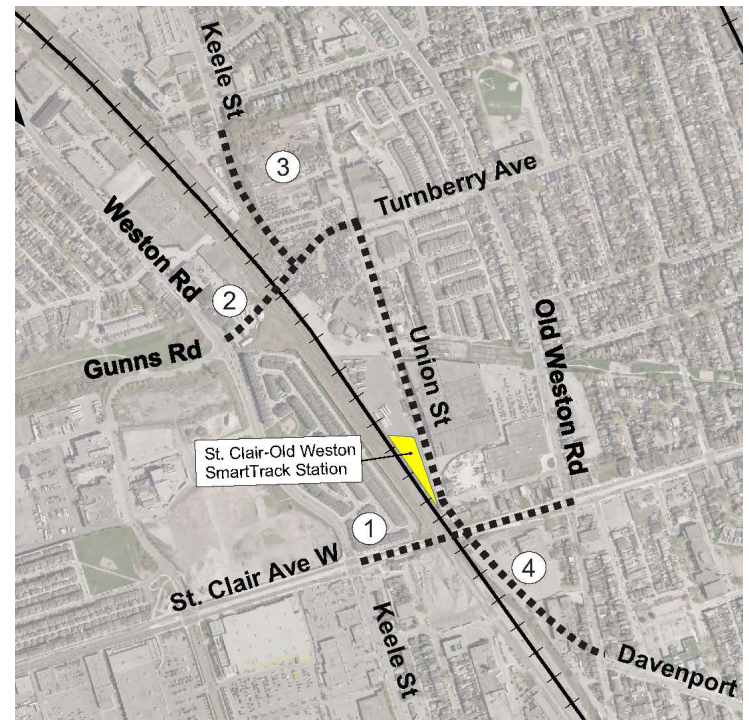


### Background

The City of Toronto is carrying out a Transportation Master Plan (TMP) Study to relieve traffic congestion, improve connections for pedestrians and cyclists, and increase access to public transit in the area of St. Clair Avenue West, between Keele Street and Old Weston Road. The Study is being carried out under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process and involves the development and evaluation of alternative infrastructure improvements and solutions.

The City is recommending four infrastructure improvements:

1. Widen St. Clair Avenue West
2. Extend Gunns Road to Union Street
3. Extend Keele Street to meet the Gunns Road Extension
4. Extend Davenport Road to Union Street
