


St. Clair Avenue West Area Transportation Master Plan

(between Keele Street and Old Weston Road)

The City of Toronto is carrying out a Transportation Master Plan (TMP) Study to relieve traffic congestion, improve connections for pedestrians and cyclists, and increase access to public transit, in the area of St. Clair Avenue West, between Keele Street and Old Weston Road.

Two public drop-in events are being held where you can learn more about the Study recommendations, view renderings of the recommended improvements, ask questions, and provide feedback. The same information will be available on both dates, including information on the new St. Clair-Old Weston SmartTrack Station.

Preliminary Recommendations

The City is recommending four infrastructure improvements:

1. Widen St. Clair Avenue West
2. Extend Gunns Road to Union Street
3. Extend Keele Street to meet the Gunns Road Extension
4. Extend Davenport Road to Union Street

The City is working closely with Metrolinx and TTC to develop the early design of a new St. Clair-Old Weston SmartTrack Station. The infrastructure improvements identified through the TMP will support access for buses, pedestrians, cyclists, and passenger pick-up/drop-off to the Station.



Background

The north/south rail corridor, in the vicinity of St. Clair Avenue West between Keele Street and Old Weston Road, limits east/west movement for vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians. This results in issues of congestion and connectivity. The Transportation Master Plan evaluated alternatives to improve movement using existing and potential new road connections for the benefit of all modes of travel.

The first public event for the St. Clair West TMP took place in December 2015, and a report and summary of feedback received is available on the project website. This is the second and final public event for the study.

What is a Transportation Master Plan?

A Transportation Master Plan is a study that examines the infrastructure needs within a geographic area and provides a framework for the implementation of recommended solutions. This study follows the Municipal Engineer's Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process. The process includes identifying the problem or opportunities, developing and evaluating a range of alternative solutions, developing design concepts for the recommended solution(s), and opportunities for public input.

What's Next?

Following the second public event, a Transportation Master Plan report will be prepared to document the study process, consultation undertaken, and alternatives assessed. The document will be made available for a 30-day public review period. If there are outstanding issues that a member of the public feels have not been addressed through the study, a request can be made to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change.
