Road Resurfacing on The Queensway from High Street to Mimico Creek


Contract #: 17ECS-TI-05MR Expected Start Date: late May, 2018 Expected End Date: July, 2018 *Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto will resurface The Queensway from High Street to 110m West of Park Lawn Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaying and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2017 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

This work was originally planned for delivery in late 2017 but has been differed to this spring due to the labour disruption at the food terminal last year.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will deliver this work in 3 phases:

Phase 1: remove and replace deteriorated sidewalk and curb and realign catch basinsPhase 2: mill (remove top asphalt) repair the concrete road basePhase 3: lay top asphalt

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners on The Queensway should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard area) such as landscaping and/or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Construction Notice

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(\downarrow)	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturdays, after hours, and on weekends as required.
\smile	Intersection work may take place overnight.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	 at least one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction during the AM rush hour from Monday to Friday 2 eastbound lanes will be maintained
	TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 80 Queensway Bus service through the work zone.
	Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.
GF6	Cyclist information: Cyclists will be required to share a single lane of traffic with vehicles where work is taking place on The Queensway.
\bigcirc	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.
	Please note that parking tickets cannot be cancelled if vehicles were parked in illegal parking spots such as in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones.
	Deliveries: Businesses may want to consider adjusting delivery times or routes as a result of the lane restrictions on The Queensway during the duration of this project.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
.	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
