Gas Remediation on Coe Hill Drive

Contract #: 17ECS-MI-02SW Start Date: June 25, 2018 End Date: September 2018 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is completing work at a closed historical landfill site, along Coe Hill Drive, to install active venting systems to release below-ground gas into the atmosphere. This work involves installing piping and blower enclosure sheds. This project is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program. FAQ is found at <u>toronto.ca/improvements/ward13.htm</u>.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the City.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.
- The sidewalk, between the bus shelter at the Coe Hill Drive Parkette and the front of 70 Coe Hill Drive, will be removed and replaced.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be partial and sidewalk closures within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.

Construction Notice

	TTC Service: This project will affect route 77 on Coe Hill Drive. The TTC will post Visit: ttc.ca for accurate schedule and routing information.
-	Tree Removal: During construction, 1 small tree will be removed, as shown on the map. The City's Urban Forestry team will provide support to organize the replacement of the tree in the area.
<u>.</u>	Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored in future stages of the work. Approximately 260 metres of sidewalk on the southwest side of Coe Hill Drive will be removed during construction in order to dig a trench for the pipe being installed. The section of removed sidewalk will be replaced with wider sidewalk to comply with current standards for replacement of sidewalk.
Ŀ.	Accessible Accommodation: Properties who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the City to arrange for access during the construction period.
8	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. No significant delays are expected during construction. <i>At times, traffic will be reduced to one lane with appropriate traffic control measures.</i>
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket at one of the locations listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Contact or Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.
