Cycling is one of the fastest growing transportation modes in Toronto. The City is working to make travel by bike safer and more inviting. Making it easier for people to choose to cycle, helps ease congestion on the streets and transit, creates a cleaner environment, and promotes a healthier public. The City supports cycling by building and maintaining bike lanes and multi-use trails, installing bike parking facilities, distributing bike network maps, and carrying out other campaigns and projects to promote cycling confidence and safe road use behaviour.

NEW BIKE LANE INSTALLATION

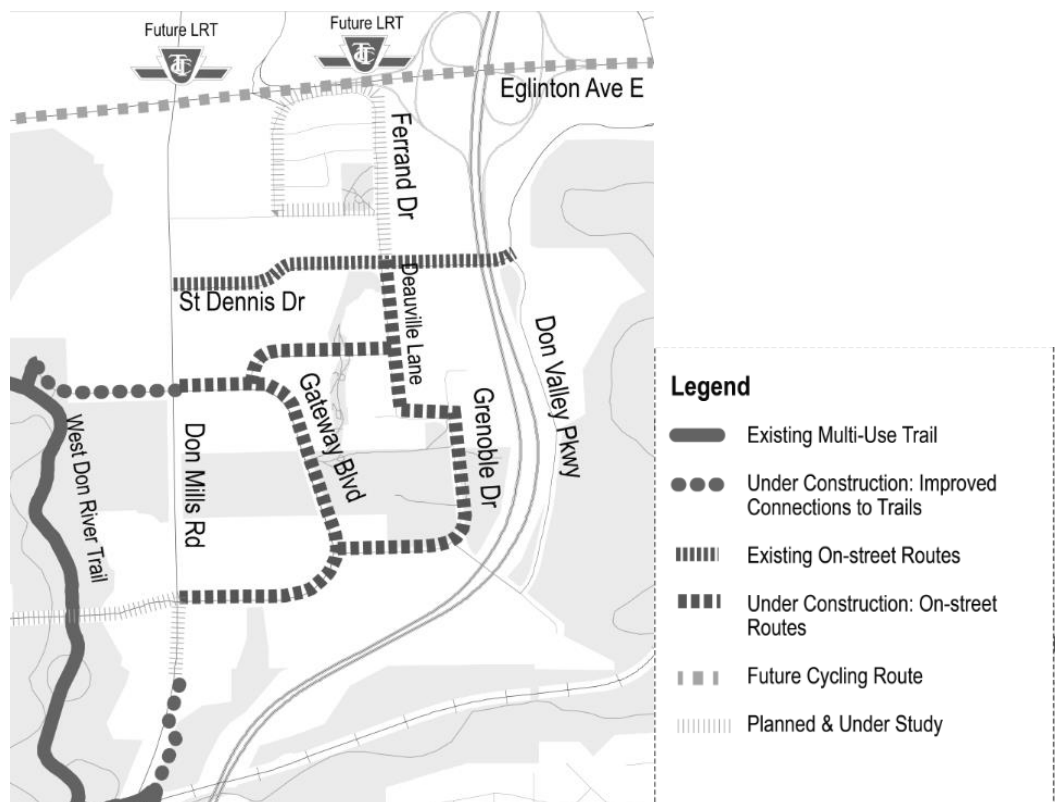
On July 23, 2018, the City of Toronto will begin installing bike lanes on the following streets in Flemingdon Park:

- Gateway Boulevard: bike lanes, and a short section of physically separated cycle tracks
- Deauville Lane: bike lanes
- Grenoble Drive: bike lanes

Trail connection improvements to E.T. Seton Park (behind the Ontario Science Centre) from the north intersection of Don Mills Road and Gateway Boulevard will be installed this summer. A trail connection from 701 Don Mills Road to the Lower Don River Trail will be built later in 2018.







This project part of the City's Council-approved Cycling Network Ten-Year Plan. After installation, the bike lanes will provide new cycling routes, connecting residents to local destinations, public transit, and the citywide cycling network. The Bike Flemingdon Park and Thorncliffe Project was approved by the Public Works and Infrastructure Committee in April 2018. Installation of bike lanes in Thorncliffe Park will begin in August 2018.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING INSTALLATION

You may experience noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place overnight and during the day. Noisy work will be limited to daytime hours, as much as possible. Work will take place in the off-peak hours/evenings to limit traffic disruptions, as much as possible.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there may be limited sidewalk closures at intersections within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, pedestrians, road users and residents.</p> <p>No significant delays are expected during construction.</p>
	<p>Cyclists: If travelling by bicycle in the area, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones until the installation of the new bike lanes is complete.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>Changes to the parking by-laws will be signed. On-street parking will be reduced on Gateway Boulevard, Grenoble Drive and Deauville Lane. Parking will be retained to meet existing demand, as measured in spring and fall 2017.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
