# Martin Goodman Trail - Unwin Avenue Connection From Leslie Street to Outer Harbour Marina Road

Expected Start Date: July 23, 2018 Expected End Date: November, 2018 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto and Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) are constructing a 740 metre segment of the Martin Goodman Trail from Leslie Street to Outer Harbour Marina Road. Construction is anticipated to start July 23 with a November completion.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 10-Year Cycling Network Plan.

This project was also part of the Baselands Trails Plan (2015) and identified as one of the 13 "Quick Start" projects to improve the recreational and ecological opportunities in Tommy Thompson Park.

#### WORK DETAILS

This construction work involves a new 4-metre wide asphalt trail, located on the south side of Unwin Avenue within the Baselands, with connections to the existing Martin Goodman Trail at the Leslie Street and Outer Harbour Marina Road intersections.

Work is planned to start at the eastern portion and move west. Construction materials and equipment will use a portion of the parking lot at Unwin Avenue and Leslie Street for storage. Materials may also be mobilized in advance of construction work along or nearby the trail alignment during construction.

Construction activities also include: installation of a barrier fence with eco-passages, trail/driveway crossings, storm water management features, and a resting area with benches. Habitat opportunities will be enhanced wherever possible. Bird nesting surveys will be carried out early to mid-July to ensure migratory bird breeding is not impacted.
