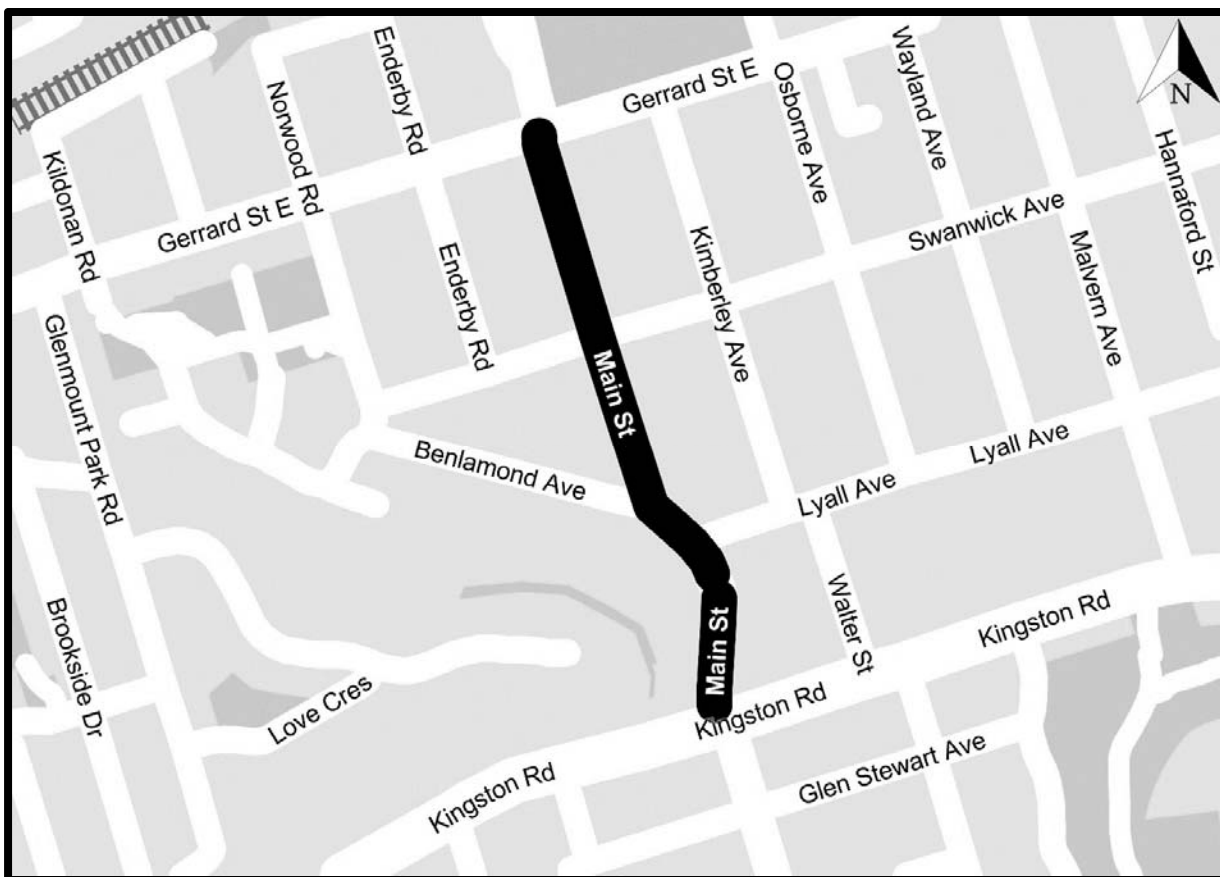
Road Resurfacing on Main Street from Kingston Road to Gerrard Street East

Contract: 18ECS-TI-07SP
Start Date: Late June, 2018
Expected End Date: August 18, 2018
**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto is resurfacing Main Street from Kingston Road to Gerrard Street East. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. To reduce the crossing distance for pedestrians and improve safety along Main Street, additional intersection work will take place involving some curb extensions and pavement reductions.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Replace any deficient curb and sidewalk
- Resurface Main St from Kingston Rd to Gerrard St E
- Realign the intersections of Main St at Benlamond Ave and Kingston Rd
- Install curb extensions Main St at Benlamond Ave, Swanwick Ave and Kingston Rd
- Install new pedestrian crossovers at Benlamond Ave and Swanwick Ave
- Install/relocate hydro poles and traffic signal equipment at Main St and Kingston Rd
- Remove old asphalt and install new asphalt on the road

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
- Work is planned for the sidewalk and boulevard, property owners with items in the boulevard will have to move them during construction. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm, Monday to Friday, including some extended hours or weekend work as approved by the City.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs and adjusting traffic signal times. One lane of vehicular traffic in each direction will be maintained on Main Street during the weekdays and most weekends. Weekend work at the intersections of Benlamond Avenue and Swanwick Avenue is planned; at which time, only one southbound lane of vehicular will be available.
	TTC Service: This project will affect service on Main Street <ul style="list-style-type: none">Monday to Friday: no diversion, buses will continue to serve Main Street. Temporary stop changes may be required depending on lane and sidewalk restrictions.Saturday and Sunday (when applicable): southbound buses travel over regular route.Northbound buses divert via Kingston Road, Woodbine Avenue, and Danforth Avenue to Main Street. Visit ttc.ca for more details.
	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.
