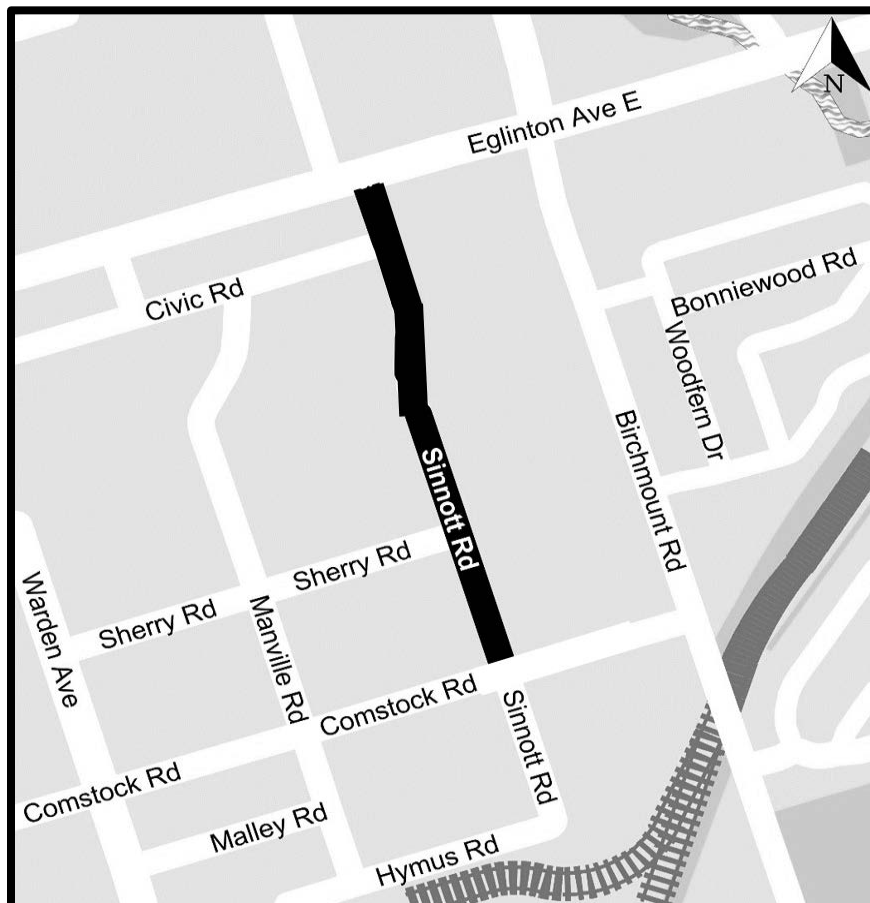

The City of Toronto will construct new sidewalk on Sinnott Road from Comstock Road to Eglinton Avenue East. The work involves constructing a new sidewalk, as well as curb and gutter, on the west side of Sinnott Road.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to provide sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

Stage 1 work - August 21 to September 7, 2018

The City's contractor will:




- Mobilize preparing for sidewalk construction
- Install tree protection and remove 5 small street trees from the City's boulevard for new sidewalk
- Replace Fire Hydrants
- Install a new storm catch basin






Stage 2 work – October 17 to December 7, 2018

- Construct a new sidewalk & curb and gutter on the west side
- Restore areas affected by construction

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping, fencing, irrigation systems and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Sinnott Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction within the work zone and to one lane with flag-persons, as required.</p>

	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. <i>You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Field Ambassador does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.</i></p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them.</p> <p><i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>City Owned Trees: due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove 5 small street trees from the City's boulevard. For street trees removed, for the work, the City will plant a replacement tree of at least 60mm in diameter. Trees in the removal area will be replaced and overseen by the City's Parks, Recreation & Forestry Division in the near future.</p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
