Purpose	August 10, 2018 Phone No.: (416) 392-8151 To obtain authority to enter into a licence agreement (the "Licence") with Metropolitan Toronto Condominium Corporation No. 557 (the "Licensor") to permit the temporary use of a portion of the Licensor's common elements to enable the vehicular and equipment access from Eunice Road to the existing municipal water infrastructure located on a portion of the Licensor's Lands to complete a watermain renovation and related works.				
Property	A portion of the common element lands described in the declaration and description of Metropolitan Toronto Condominium Corporation No. 557, as registered in the Land Registry Office pursuant to the Condominium Act, located at the property municipally known as 1100 Sheppard Avenue East containing a legal description of Part of Blocks B and C, Plan M1846 and Part of Lot 16 Concession II, East of Yonge Street, City of Toronto (formerly in the City of North York) (the "Property"), displayed on the maps attached hereto as Appendix "A" and labelled as Parts 1-6 on sketch PS-2016-036 attached hereto as Appendix "B" (the Licensed Lands").				
Actions	 Authority be granted for the City to enter into the Licence substantially on the terms and conditions set out below together with such other terms and conditions as may be satisfactory to the Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services (the "DCM") and in a form acceptable to the City Solicitor. 				
	2. The Director of Real Estate Services shall administer and manage the Licence, including the provision of any consents, approvals, waivers, notices and notice of termination provided that the DCM may, at any time, refer consideration of such matters (including their content) to City Council for its determination and direction.				
	3. The appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take the necessary action to give effect thereto, including but not limited to the execution of the Licence.				
Financial Impact	The City will reimburse the Licensor for its proven legal and other professional expenses, limited to an amount not exceeding \$5,000.00 (plus applicable taxes).				
	Funding for this cost is available in the 2018 Council Approved Capital Budget and Plan for Toronto Water under capital account CWW470-02.				
	The Interim Chief Financial Officer has reviewed this DAF and agrees with the financial impact information.				
Comments	The Toronto Water Division has identified that repairs/renovations to the existing watermain and related works situated on the Property are necessary to protect the integrity of the service and surrounding lands. The City has existing easement rights over the portion of the Property where the excavation and repair work will occur however, it is preferred to acquire additional temporary rights on the Property in order to facilitate the smooth operation of the pending renovation project.				
	The proposed renovations will employ a trenchless method of construction whereby a launching pit will be drilled within the easement lands. The pit will then be used to provide an access point through which a pipe-liner material will be introduced into the interior of the watermain.				
	The Licence will authorize the City to access various portions of the Property to carry out the pending watermain renovation project.				
	As per the terms of the Licence, the City will restore any damage to the Property as a result of the renovation project. City staff deem the terms of the proposed Licence to be fair and reasonable to both parties.

General Conditions ("GC")

- (a) The local Councillor (or local Councillors if the subject property is located on a ward boundary or if the transaction involves an exchange of properties in more than one ward), will be consulted prior to the exercise of delegated Approving Authority by staff for all Acquisitions, Disposals, Land Exchanges and Leases. In the event of a vacancy in the Ward in which the subject property is located, the Mayor's office shall be consulted in the alternative.
- (b) Where approving power has been delegated to staff, the Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services, in consultation with any other applicable Deputy City Manager or the City Manager, may determine that such matter is of such special interest that same should be returned to the relevant Committee and Council for consideration and determination.
- (c) Exercise of delegated authority is subject to all applicable Council policies, statutes or other applicable law.
- (d) Authority to approve financial commitments/expenditures is subject to all amounts being available in an approved budget, or funding being available from third party sources, except for "Strategic Property Acquisitions" as set out in EX44.22 adopted by Council August 25, 26, 27 and 28, 2014, which identifies alternative funding mechanisms subject to additional approval requirements.
- (e) Property interests are to be based on appraised value, and no interest shall be granted at less than market value unless otherwise specifically authorized.
- (f) Authority to approve transactions at less than market value is subject to statutory anti-bonusing provisions.
- (g) Total compensation means the aggregate of all types of payments, including land value, estimated clean-up costs, potential arbitration awards, loss claims, etc., but exclusive of any applicable taxes and registration costs.
- (h) Authority to acquire property is conditional upon provision being made to bring the property into compliance with applicable MOE or other requirements such that it will be fit for its intended municipal purpose, except for property acquisitions of 50M² or less for transit shelter purposes.
- (i) Authority to initiate the permanent road closure process in A.4 is conditional upon confirmation by the GM of Transportation Services that it is feasible to permanently close the highway.
- (j) Disposal authorities in A.7 are subject to the property having been declared surplus, and the disposal policy complied with.
- (k) Land exchanges, except for those in A.8, may be authorized based on the delegated Approving Authority for disposals in A.7.
- (I) Approving Authority with respect to land located in the Designated Waterfront Area as defined in the *Toronto Waterfront Revitalization Corporation Act*, 2002 is conditional upon the approval of the Director, Waterfront Secretariat.
- (m) Authority to approve an exchange of land in A.8 is conditional upon confirmation by the Chief Planner and Executive Director of City Planning, and the GM of Parks, Forestry & Recreation, that the land being exchanged is (i) nearby land of equivalent or larger area, and (ii) of comparable or superior green space utility.
- (n) Approving Authority in A.9 Leases (City as Landlord) but not Licences (City as Licensor) is limited to periods (including options/renewals) of less than twenty-one (21) years, as leases of 21 years or more may be authorized based on the delegated Approving Authority for disposals in A.7.
- (o) Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is landlord (A.9) includes the value of tenant improvements if factored into tenant's rental payments.
- (p) Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is the tenant (A.10) includes the value of any tenant improvements to be paid by the City.
- (q) Where options/renewals are included in leases, if the renewal rent is to be determined at a date later than the original approval date, total compensation is to be calculated as though all options are exercised, estimating the renewal rent based on the highest rent payable in the first term of the lease.
- (r) Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is landlord (A.9) or tenant (A.10) is to be calculated from the date of approval pursuant to this delegation (ie. first allowing for the expiry of any prior approvals, whether by Council or a delegated authority).
- (s) Approving Authority in leasing matters includes authority to approve renewals/extensions within the parameters of the delegated Approving Authority.
- (t) Approving Authority includes authority for amendments within the parameters of the delegated Approving Authority, the cumulative total of which may not exceed the delegated financial limit.
- (u) Where proposed additional amounts in A.13 exceed 10 per cent of the original decision, even if otherwise in compliance with all other conditions, then Approving Authority is transferred upwards to the next more senior level of Approving Authority having the relevant overall financial limit.
- (v) Approving Authority includes authority for all documents necessary to implement the authority, including ancillary agreements, on terms and conditions satisfactory to the Approving Authority, in consultation with the relevant operating Division(s).
- (w) Staff positions referred to in this delegation include successors from time to time.
- (x) Documents are to be in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor (including indemnity and insurance provisions).
- (y) Delegated signing authorities in **B** are conditional upon the documents having received the City Solicitor's prior "Approval as to Form".
- Authority to use land acquired by the City for parking purposes by the Toronto Parking Authority is conditional upon Council enacting a by-law designating such use.
- (aa) All residential leasing documents shall adhere to the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 and any successor legislation.
- (bb) Despite GC(n), Approving Authority in residential leasing matters is not limited to periods of less than twenty-one (21) years and total compensation in residential leasing matters where the City is landlord is to be calculated based on an assumed term of ten years unless the lease term expressly identified therein is longer.
- (cc) Where Approving Authority has been delegated to the Manager level, such authority shall be conditional upon the Manager first having secured the written concurrence of a second Manager within the Real Estate Services Division.
- (dd) Where the City is transacting with a public agency, and such agency requires that an unqualified environmental indemnity be granted by the City, the authority to acquire property includes authority to grant such an indemnity, provided that the Phase I and Phase II environmental site assessments undertaken on behalf of the City have identified no significant environmental impacts or human health threats, with no, or minor action required ("Low Risk").
