The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct the laneway between Margueretta Street and Brock Street north of Bloor Street. Our inspection of the laneway shows that it needs reconstruction to bring it to a state of good repair.



This work is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and laneways for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Access to Your Home / Property: The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.
