The City supports cycling by building and maintaining bike lanes and multi-use trails, installing bike parking facilities, distributing bike network maps, and carrying out other campaigns and projects to promote cycling confidence and safe road use behaviour.


### SHOREHAM DRIVE CYCLE TRACK INSTALLATION AND SCHEDULE

The City of Toronto will be installing protected cycle tracks on Shoreham Drive from The Pond Road / Ian MacDonald Boulevard to the Black Creek Bridge starting on August 20, 2018. This is part of the York University and Downsview Cycling Connections Project, which was approved by Toronto City Council in June 2018. The City's Cycling Network Plan identifies existing, planned, and proposed cycling facilities near York University – Keele campus.

The Shoreham Drive cycle tracks will provide a significant new route for cyclists travelling to and from the campus and connecting with the Black Creek Trail. Motor vehicle lanes will be reduced to one lane in each direction along this portion of Shoreham Drive during and after installation. The Shoreham Drive cycle tracks will also be extended from Black Creek Bridge to Jane Street, once scheduled sewer rehabilitation work is completed (anticipated in 2018-2019).

# **Construction Notice**

#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

Crews will be working on Shoreham Drive to remove some existing pavement markings, and add new pavement markings and flexi-post bollards. You may experience noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place overnight and during the day. Work with significant noise impacts will be limited to daytime hours as much as possible. Work will take place in the evenings and other off-peak hours to limit traffic disruptions as much as possible.
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be minimal sidewalk closures within the installation work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<b>Driveway Access</b> : The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, pedestrians, road users and residents.
	No significant delays are expected during cycle track installation.
G D	<b>Cyclists:</b> If travelling by bicycle in the area, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones until the installation of the new cycle track is complete.
$(\mathbb{R})$	<b>Parking:</b> Parking is not permitted on Shoreham Drive. This will continue through the installation period and after the installation of the cycle tracks. If your parked vehicle affects the installation work, it may be towed. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b> .
