### NEW BIKE LANE INSTALLATION

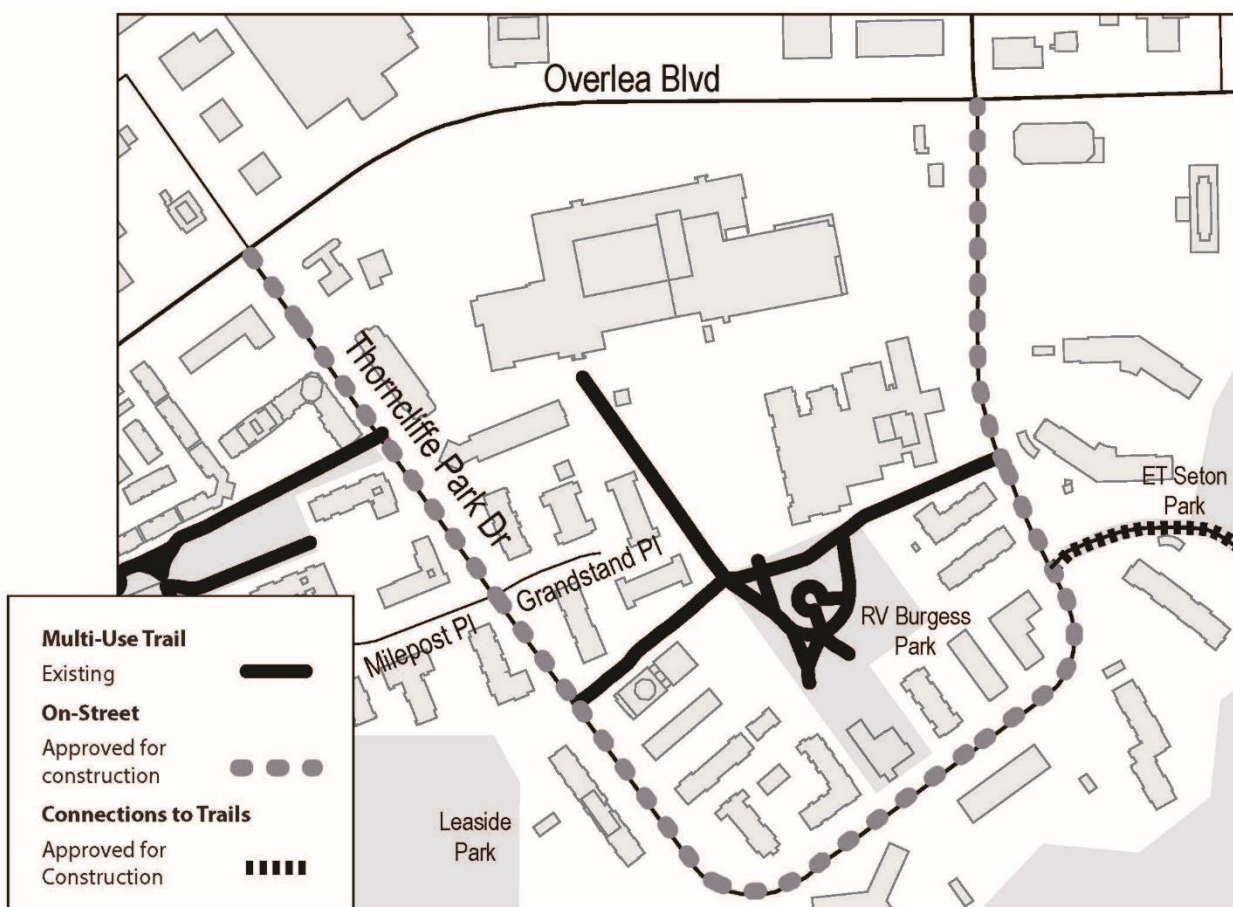
On September 4, 2018, the City of Toronto will begin installing bike lanes on Thorncliffe Park Drive.

Trail connection improvements to E.T. Seton Park from Thorncliffe Park Drive will be installed this summer. A trail connection from 701 Don Mills Road to the Lower Don Trail is scheduled to be built in Spring 2019.

The Bike Flemington Park and Thorncliffe Project also includes installation of bike facilities on Gateway Boulevard, Grenoble Drive and Deauville Lane in Flemington Park. Due to utility-related repairs, these bike lane installations will be delayed in some sections. The Flemington Park bike lanes are still anticipated to be complete in 2018.







This project is part of the City Council-approved Ten-Year Cycling Network Plan. After installation, the bike lanes will provide new cycling routes, connecting residents to local destinations, public transit, and the citywide cycling network.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING INSTALLATION

You may experience noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place overnight and during the day. Noisy work will be limited to daytime hours, as much as possible. Work will take place in the off-peak hours/evenings to limit traffic disruptions, as much as possible.
	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there may be limited sidewalk closures at intersections within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. <b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open.
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, pedestrians, road users and residents. No significant delays are expected during construction.
	<b>Cyclists:</b> If travelling by bicycle in the area, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones until the installation of the new bike lanes is complete.
	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at <b>416-808-2222</b> .  Changes to the parking by-laws will be signed. After installation, on-street parking will be reduced on Thorncliffe Park Drive. Approximately 10 spaces will be located in front of 53 Thorncliffe Park Drive to serve the Jenner Jean-Marie Community Centre and Thorncliffe Public Library.
	<b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them.
