Summary of Decisions

1. Shamim Chowdhury (Report No. 6969)

Applicant for the Renewal of Vehicle-For-Hire Driver's Licence No. D01-4430475

DECISION:

The Tribunal adjourned this matter to September 20, 2018, on consent by all parties. Mr. Chowdhury's Lawyer was unavailable to attend today's hearing.

A Bengali interpreter will be provided for Mr. Chowdhury.

2. Parthiban Panchalingam (Report No. 6994)

Applicant for a Tow Truck Driver's Licence (Application No. B804854)

DECISION:

The Tribunal approved the joint Proposed Resolution:

A Tow Truck Driver's Licence will be issued to Applicant, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) All fees, documents and/or any outstanding requirements must be submitted to the satisfaction of Municipal Licensing and Standards within 30 days of the Tribunal hearing, failing which the application may be cancelled;
- (2) Immediately upon being issued, Tow Truck Driver's Licence will be placed on probation for a period of two (2) years. The Applicant is advised that during the probationary period, MLS may conduct additional checks of any driving, criminal, and by-law charges and convictions against the Applicant and conduct other investigations as appropriate, to assess the Applicant's compliance with the requirements of Chapter 545 of the Municipal Code and other applicable laws;
- (3) Prior to each of the next two (2) renewals of the licence, the Applicant must provide to Municipal Licensing and Standards, at his own expense, an original up-to-date abstract of his criminal record;

- (4) During the probationary period, if Municipal Licensing and Standards has concerns with any new charges or convictions against the Applicant or any other concerns with respect to the conduct of the licensee, those matters and report No. 6994, and any updating material, may be brought back before the Tribunal for a full hearing.

3. Syed Ahmed Ali (Report No. 7035)

Applicant for the Renewal of Vehicle-For-Hire Driver's Licence No. D01-4704799

DECISION:

The Tribunal approved the joint Proposed Resolution:

Vehicle-For-Hire Driver's Licence will be renewed, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) All fees, documents and/or any outstanding requirements must be submitted to the satisfaction of Municipal Licensing and Standards within 30 days of the Tribunal hearing, failing which the licence will be cancelled;
- (2) Immediately upon being renewed, Vehicle-For-Hire Driver's Licence will be placed on probation for a period of three (3) years;
- (3) Prior to each of the next three (3) renewals of the licence, Syed Ahmed Ali must provide to Municipal Licensing and Standards, at his own expense, an original up-to-date abstract of his driving record;
- (4) During the probationary period, if Municipal Licensing and Standards has concerns with any new charges or convictions against Syed Ahmed Ali, those matters and report no. 7035, and any updating material, may be brought back before the Tribunal for a full hearing.

4. Mohammad J. Akhter (Report No. 7024)

Applicant for the Renewal of Retail Store (Food) Licence No. B50-4062816

DECISION:

The Tribunal renewed Retail Store (Food) Licence No. B50-4062816 without conditions.

5. Mike J. Wilson (Report No. 6938)

Applicant for the Renewal of Tow Truck Driver's Licence No. D09-4675484

DECISION:

The Tribunal approved the Proposed Resolution: Condition's 2 and 3 have been amended to the joint Proposed Resolution dated July 10, 2018.

Tow Truck Driver's Licence will be renewed, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) All fees, documents and/or any outstanding requirements must be submitted to the satisfaction of Municipal Licensing and Standards within 30 days of the Tribunal hearing, failing which the licence may be cancelled;
- (2) Tow Truck Driver's Licence will be renewed and suspended for five (5) days. Mr. Wilson must surrender his licence and photo card to Municipal Licensing and Standards on August 13, 2018 (8:30 a.m.) until August 17, 2018 (3:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.);
- (3) Tow Truck Driver's Licence will continue on probation until March 1, 2021. The Applicant is advised that during the probationary period, MLS may make additional checks of any driving, criminal, and by-law charges and convictions against the Applicant and conduct other investigations, as appropriate, to assess the Applicant's compliance with the requirements of Chapter 545 of the Municipal Code and other applicable laws;
- (4) Prior to the renewals of the licence in 2019, 2020 and 2021, Mike J. Wilson must provide to Municipal Licensing and Standards, at his own expense, his original, up-to-date criminal record;
- (5) During the probationary period, if Municipal Licensing and Standards has concerns with any new charges or convictions against Mike J. Wilson or any other concerns with respect to the conduct of the licensee, those matters and report No. 6938, and any updating material, may be brought back before the Tribunal for a full hearing.

6. Emilie Boucher (Report No. 7052)
Applicant for a Body Rubber's Licence (Application No. B833957)

DECISION:

The Tribunal approved the joint Proposed Resolution:

Body Rubber's Licence will be issued to Emilie Boucher, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) All fees, documents and/or any outstanding requirements must be submitted to the satisfaction of Municipal Licensing and Standards within 30 days of the Tribunal hearing, failing which the application may be cancelled;
- (2) Immediately upon being issued, Body Rubber's Licence will be placed on probation for a period of two (2) years. The Applicant is advised that during the probationary period, MLS may make additional checks of any driving, criminal, and by-law charges and convictions against the Applicant and conduct other investigations, as appropriate, to assess the Applicant's compliance with the requirements of Chapter 545 of the Municipal Code and other applicable laws;
- (3) Prior to each of the next two (2) renewals of the licence, Emilie Boucher must provide to Municipal Licensing and Standards at her own expense an original up-to-date abstract of her criminal record;
- (4) During the probationary period, if Municipal Licensing and Standards has concerns with any new charges or convictions against Emilie Boucher or any other concerns with respect to the conduct of the licensee, those matters and report no. 7052, and any updating material, may be brought back before the Tribunal for a full hearing.
