

Materials:

Materials are not included in adult course fees. Please inquire at the Cedar Ridge Office or with your instructor for supply lists. Pottery students must purchase clay from Cedar Ridge Creative Centre, which includes glazing, firing and technician costs. \$35 per bag, cash or cheque only.

POTTERY

Pottery: Introduction

This course is for beginners who have little to no pottery experience. Students become familiar with the pottery studio and various clay types while working on handbuilding techniques, stamping and glazing.

Pottery: Beginner

Learn to work with pottery tools and equipment such as a slab roller and study basic wheel techniques. The process of greenware, bisqueware and glazeware from clay to pot is taught as well as reclaiming techniques.

Pottery: Intermediate

Refine techniques learned in beginner courses, improving on throwing and handbuilding techniques. Be introduced to more complex forms and learn to make repetitive shapes. Students gain basic knowledge of the kiln firing process and different glazing techniques with increased one-on-one attention. Prerequisite: students must be able to centre, have taken three beginner sessions, or have a strong familiarity with wheel techniques.

Pottery: Advanced

Throwing sets and more complex forms, students explore decoration using basic colour theory and principles of good design, as well as advanced glazing techniques to develop their own style. The program includes a theoretical overview of kilns: loading, how glazes respond scientifically, cones and testing. Prerequisite: must have taken three intermediate sessions and have a strong wheel throwing background.

Intermediate/Advanced Wheel Work

Refine wheel throwing techniques through demonstration and individual instruction. Forms produced from joined wheel thrown parts will be introduced. Students will learn to critique their own forms in order to advance their techniques. Prerequisite: must have considerable (min. four advanced sessions) experience with wheel throwing, centering and hand building.

Sculpture: Beginner

This course is an introduction to the fundamentals of clay sculpture. Each class begins with a short talk and demonstration about ceramic sculpture. Students are encouraged to practice their talents in clay slab building, modeling figures, creating abstract sculptures, and bring them to completion with glazing.



Sculpture: All Levels

This course guides the beginner students through the basics of ceramic sculpture and challenges the more experienced students to explore more complex techniques. Each class begins with a short discussion and demonstration about ceramic sculpture.

*Please note: All students taking Pottery must purchase clay from Cedar Ridge Creative Centre, which includes glazing, firing and technician costs. \$35 per bag, cash or cheque only.

VISUAL ARTS

Drawing Fundamentals: Level 1

This course teaches the visual language that is in all of us. Join us to learn basic drawing and painting techniques, including contouring and shading, and discover how colour and lines can help express the world around you in 2D form. All exercises will develop your observation and creative skills.

Drawing Fundamentals: Level 2

Study linear tone, exploring several varieties of hatching to achieve light and shade, to learn basic colour principles. Students are encouraged to develop their personal style. Prerequisite: Level 1, equivalent, or one to two years drawing experience.

Drawing and Painting

Expand your working knowledge of drawing and painting through elements of perspective, shape, colour, value and texture. Individual instruction will help students to explore aspects of their preferred media such as pencil, watersoluble oils, acrylic or watercolour.

Drawing and Painting: Beginner/ Intermediate

Learn how to stretch and prepare canvas for various wet and dry mediums. Students explore techniques including rubber stamping, image transfers and collage techniques to express ideas through their art.

Fine Art: Animal Studies

Learn how to draw animals, wildlife and pets. Students study basic shapes and animal anatomy, and learn techniques for drawing fur and feathers, as well as animal expressions and behaviour. Learn how to draw your furry and not so furry friends.

Intermediate/Advanced Painting

Explore urban landscapes using mixed media and a variety of techniques. Students are invited to embed their personal memories and experiences into their work to develop their personal style.

Painting with Acrylic and Oil

Expand your working knowledge of painting using acrylic or oil. Elements of perspective, shape, colour, value and texture are examined. Individual instruction will help students delve into aspects of their preferred media. No solvents.

Polymer Clay Sculpture: Figure & Character

This class teaches students to sculpt characters, busts and figures in Polymer Clay. Students learn how to design and build armatures. Other topics include tooling, smoothing and baking the clay.

Portrait Drawing

Students develop an understanding of portraiture and learn to draw the human portrait using photographs and direct observation. Studies of human features strengthen understanding of these forms. Composition, lighting, tone and shadow will be explored. Beginner to Intermediate level.

VISUAL ARTS (CONTINUED)

Professional Development 1: Exhibition Preparation

Creating your art work is only one part of having a show, there are many other aspects to consider. Learn how to strengthen and select works for exhibition. Plus, find out about the various types of gallery spaces available, preparing proposals and applying for grants.

Professional Development 2: Finding Funding, Grants and Applications

As an artist, finding funding is an important and ongoing aspect of sustaining and exhibiting your work. This five week course focuses on the different levels of Arts Councils (Toronto, Ontario and Canada) and other funding opportunities. Learn how to write proposals: find out what is and isn't funded and leave with a proposal.

Watercolours: All Levels

A course for everyone, beginners are individually supported, and experienced students work on more advanced projects. This course is organized thematically with weekly demonstrations, instructions, and individual critiques.

Watercolours: Beginner

This course covers techniques in watercolour, as well as the study of composition, value, colour and negative painting processes through various painting exercises.

Watercolours: Intermediate

Develop a critical eye while experimenting with painting wet-in-wet, pouring colour, using multiple washes and learning to develop brush work techniques.

Wildlife Art

Learn to render your favourite animal and capture its form, mood, character and movement using drawing and painting techniques. All skill levels are welcomed.

VISUAL ARTS WORKSHOPS



Acrylic Landscape Painting

Bring a landscape painting you're working on, or work with instructor Marjan Verstappen to complete a large tryptic of the Cedar Ridge building and grounds. Come paint in a relaxed atmosphere and develop your confidence in painting.

Botanical Illustration

Perfect for gardeners, plant enthusiasts, and anyone wanting to improve their observational skills. Learn about the rich history of botanical illustration, and how it contributes to specific methods of identifying and recording plants. Grow as an artist by developing a range of painting and drawing techniques.

Dramatic Shading Techniques

Get inspired to draw! Create awesome shading effects ranging from the bold and dramatic to soft and delicate that can be incorporated easily into your own personal style! With a focus on composition, core elements of contrast, value, texture, and mark making to create remarkable illusions on paper, this class is guaranteed to excite you and improve your drawing skills. Beginners +

Henna Designs

Learn the art of traditional and contemporary henna design. Students learn how to hold a cone, make their own henna, decorate canvas and be introduced to Jagua, an organic alternative to black henna. Materials fee is \$10 per participant.

Intaglio: Beginner/Intermediate

This workshop is for beginner and intermediate printmakers, where participants learn Intaglio techniques including etching, drypoint, soft ground, mezzotint, aquatint, lift ground and open bites. Students will produce prints in any given technique or combination of techniques. \$20 material fee.

Ikebana: Japanese Art of Flower Arrangement

Practice your personal creative expression of beauty and harmony in nature using a modern school of Japanese flower arrangement, Sogetsu Ikebana. \$10 per session fee for materials. Starter kit cost is \$45 and textbook is \$25, payable to the instructor. Please bring your own flower scissors, or you may purchase high quality Japanese flower scissors from instructor for \$48.

Just Do It! Contemporary Experimental Painting

Explores the art of non-representational abstraction in the medium of acrylic painting. Participants experiment and explore and learn to let go of rules and inhibitions. Each week features a unique theme. The exercises inspire participants to play and find their own personal style, while experimenting with today's versatile and forgiving acrylic painting products. Suitable for enthusiastic beginners and current artists who wish to move towards a loose and exploratory style.

Botanical Masterpiece

Complete a highly detailed botanical illustration from start to finish in this one day intensive workshop.

Science Fiction Illustration

Hone your skills in observational drawing and then use them to spark your imagination. Practice drawing from photos and from life, learn to combine different features of plants and animals into realistic images. A fun, imaginative way to brush up on drawing and painting skills.

Texture, Depth, and Tone: Focus on Still Life Drawing and Painting

Get up close to objects. Learn how to master a still-life, while improving your drawing and painting skills. Duplicate shiny/reflective surfaces, liquids, crystal and food. Perfect for beginners and experienced painters wanting to brush up on making objects appear real.

WORKSHOPS WITH JENNIE TOWN

Do you have an interest in Ojibwa culture and want more meaningful understandings of Indigenous histories and stories? Take one or all three workshops with ceremony leader and artist Jennifer Town. Workshops offer opportunities to create traditional handmade artworks and learn Ojibwa teachings, narratives and traditions.

Baby Moccasin Workshop

Become immersed in interesting facts and the history of clothing and regalia of the Indigenous Peoples, by crafting your own pair of traditional deerskin baby moccasins. Learn how to properly manipulate deerskin and use traditional hand sewing techniques to complete your own pair of baby moccasins. No experience is necessary for this one-day workshop; material cost is \$25, payable to the instructor.

Beading / Loom Beading

Historically, beading is an important part of Indigenous culture and was part of a social pastime where friends and family gathered to bead together and shared knowledges and stories of the day. In this workshop, learn the design process and traditional techniques to create your own loom bead artwork, shaped as a bracelet or card holder or book mark. Material cost is \$25, payable to the instructor.

Dreamcatchers or "Sacred Hoops" Family workshop

The dreamcatcher reminds us how important the dream world has been to people throughout time. Learn about the colourful history and the different legends during this step by step workshop. Once you have learned the traditional techniques, let your imaginations soar, as you create a beautiful dreamcatcher for your family. Materials included.

The Art of Animation (8-13yrs)

Students learn elements and techniques of stop-motion animation and filmmaking, such as storyboarding and set design/construction. Students employ these skills when creating their own animations, complete with original characters and sets.

Cartooning (8-13 yrs)

Cartooning allows students to combine their love of drawing with storytelling. This course focuses on the knowledge and skills required to create a comic book with original cartoon characters, from storyboard to finished product. Other projects include, comic strips, character study sheets, poster art and seasonal cartoons.

Creative Clay (7-10 & 11-13 yrs)

Students explore the possibilities of creating with clay. Basic pottery techniques such as pinching, coiling, slab and glazing are introduced. Projects are designed to stimulate the imagination and develop pottery skills.

Exploring Arts Media (6-10 yrs)

Students become familiar with different media while producing fine art projects and some unique crafts. Participants have the opportunity to expand their creativity in a happy, welcoming environment. The projects vary on a weekly or bi-weekly basis over the 10-week session.

Family Time: Making Art Together (5+) with Kim Carson

Make something great together. Build memories, find time to learn, grow and share in a fun, positive and inspiring environment. In this family art class, everyone is to get involved, get a bit messy and share some good laughs. Each week the class focuses on a new area of art making that will support the interaction between families by spending quality time together.

Paint Like the Masters (7-13 yrs)

Each week students learn about the life and work of a different world famous artist. Students then create their own masterpiece inspired by that week's feature artist. Art history and different art techniques enrich students' understanding and appreciation of art.

Painting Through Time (14-17 yrs)

Hone your artistic skills and develop your style through a survey of Western artists, including Monet, Matisse, Georgia O'Keefe and Banksy. This workshop explores portraiture, landscape, life drawing and street art through drawing, painting and stenciling in a variety of media.

Photography in Focus (9-13 yrs)

This introductory hands-on course in digital photography develops students' understanding and use of digital cameras. Each class builds on

the skills from the previous week, taking steps to build provoking compositions and explore new worlds through a digital lens. Cameras provided or bring your own.

Portfolio Workshop (14-17 yrs)

Applying to an arts-based high school? This workshop focuses on building skills required for the visual art aspect of your portfolio and interview. Learn how to put together a portfolio that makes your strengths as an artist shine. Topics covered include drawing from life, shading and perspective, brushstrokes and creative problem solving.

Pottery Mixed Media (7-10 & 11-13 yrs)

Students become familiar with different media while producing a clay based fine art project, including, but not limited to, decorative boxes, wind chimes, animal figurines, jewelry, and mixed media paintings with glazed clay.

Sketch 2 Draw (8-13 yrs)
