Road Resurfacing on Eastern Avenue from Knox Avenue to Marigold Avenue

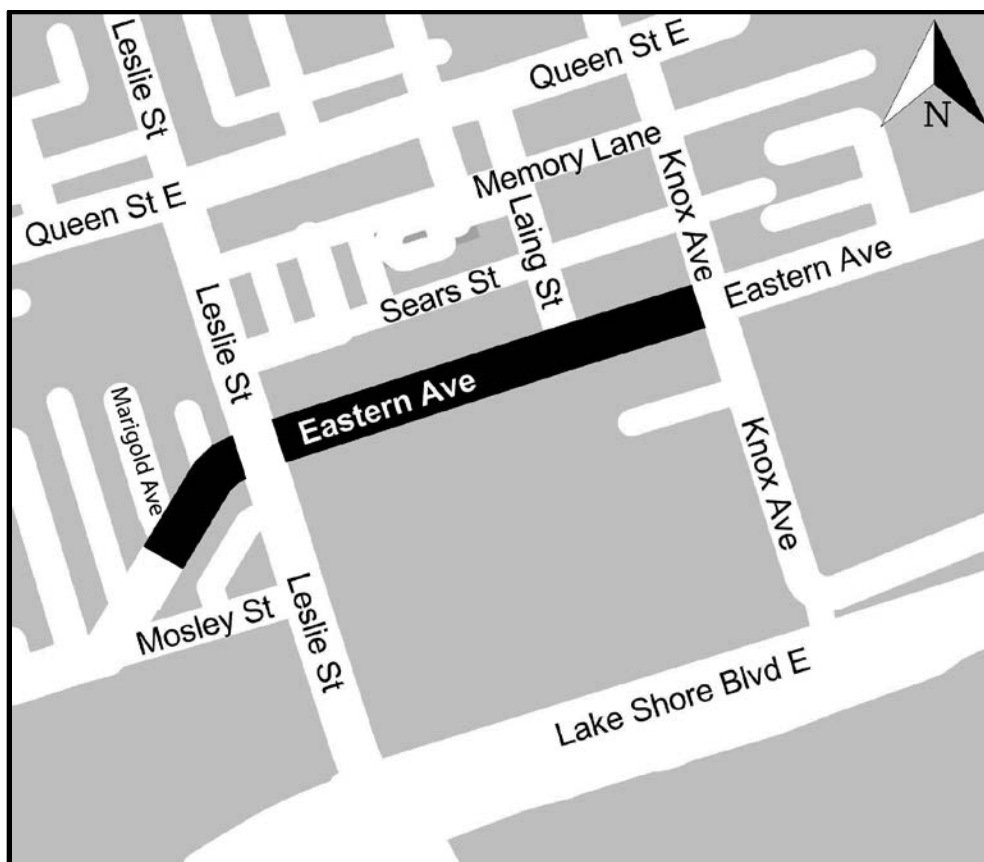
Contract: 18ECS-TI-07SP

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface the road on Eastern Avenue from Knox Avenue to Marigold Avenue. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

The original start date for this project was September 10, 2018. The revised start date is August 20, 2018 due to the early completion of other projects.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Replace any deficient curb and sidewalk
- Resurface Eastern Avenue from Knox Avenue to Marigold Avenue

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
- Work is planned for the sidewalk and boulevard, property owners with items in the boulevard will have to move them during construction. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p>One lane of vehicular traffic in each direction will be maintained on Eastern Avenue at all times. No work is scheduled on Leslie Street.</p>
	<p>Cyclists: Temporary closures of the cycling lanes on Eastern Avenue from Marigold Avenue to Leslie Street will be required. Advanced signage will be used to inform cyclist to merge with traffic.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: TTC buses will continue to serve Eastern Avenue. Temporary stop changes may be required depending on lane and sidewalk restrictions.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.</p>
  	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area.</p> <p>Sidewalks along Eastern Avenue will remain accessible and pedestrians will be safely detoured around the work area to access local businesses.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Accommodation: Residents that require accommodation must contact the project manager to arrange for access during construction.</p>
